<u>Junior Edition - K12</u> is for students in grades 6 through to high school students, with magazines, newspapers and reference books for information on current events, the arts, science, pop culture, health, people, government, history, sports and more.



<u>Canada In Context</u> covers a broad range of Canadian topics. Its information is written from a Canadian perspective, and includes magazines, academic journals, news, primary source documents, images, videos, audio and links to approved websites organized into a user-friendly portal.



<u>Science In Context</u> has information on hundreds of today's most important science topics. It has encyclopedia-type reference information combined with magazines, academic journals, news articles, experiments, images, videos, audio files and links to great websites.



<u>GREENR (Global Reference on the Environment, Energy, and Natural Resources)</u> focuses on physical, social, and economic aspects of environmental issues like energy systems, health care, agriculture, climate change, population, and economic development. It includes news, primary source documents, statistics, and multimedia.



<u>Gale PowerSearch</u> lets users conduct research with ease and quickly produce relevant search results. Features include Search Assist including "Did You Mean?...", recommendations and limiters for every search, language translation options and Read Speaker, which reads non-English documents.
