#### **Entry Plan for First Day**

On the first day of school, we have the following gathering places for parents and students:

- -Grade 1 students report to the Gym at 8:00 a.m.

Maccarone and Mme Smith, wearing a vest and carrying a master list of classes, to assist students in finding their classroom. Please locate one of these teachers if you have questions about where to go.

Classroom lists will be posted outside of each classroom and on the walls in the assigned area of each grade. Teachers will be holding a sign indicating their grade level and will have a class list.

### Transportation Reminder

Dear Parents/Guardians,

This letter is to remind you that your son/daughter's school bus transportation eligibility can change throughout his/her school career. Because walking distance requirements change in Grade 4 and your son/daughter will be attending Grade 4 next year, we encourage you to review his/her eligibility.

Busing in the York Region District School Board is provided in collaboration with the York Catholic District School Board and is governed by Board Policy #680 Student Transportation (full policy on the Board website at <a href="https://www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca">www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca</a>). Below are the general provisions of eligibility identified in the Student Transportation Policy:

- · All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- · All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- · All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

The distance is measured from the end of any driveway, via the shortest distance to the closest access point of the school property. Measurements are conducted using GIS software and confirmed via aerial photos. #### THANK-YOU

There are so many thank-yous at this time of year. Thank you to all the parents and grandparents who contributed in the school and with council activities to provide extra resources and activities for our kids!

We appreciate very much the parents that came in to take care of our Pizza Days. That hour of time every week makes pizza day possible! We had five days a week of food programs this year, which is a ton of hours for overall organization. We also had several parents preparing Crunchy Munchy, our healthy snack program for students who have forgotten their snack or would like an extra snack. We have a milk program that has dedicated volunteers in the school every week. Thanks to you all!

We very much appreciate the time of parents who serve on school council, bringing forward ideas and contributing to fundraising for extra school resources. This year with the support of the school community over \$30 000 was raised. Our largest fundraisers are Pizza Days, Fun Festival, QSP Magazine subscriptions, Food Programs, Milk Program, and Moveathon. These programs have supported many resources this year and into next year as we have already been able to allocate funds to programs to start up in the fall. We also put on a Parent Engagement Night with over 60 parents coming out.

#### JUNE ACTIVTIES

In May our Moveathon event raised close to \$2000. The students achieved all the Moveathon incentives and in June enjoyed an extended recess, and no-homework day. Mme Baage visited each class as a student for a day, and most exciting, Mme Ramsperger's grade 5s represented the students in a student-teacher soccer game. It was a close match that finished with a 2-2 score. Thanks to all our teacher and student players, and the senior students who helped with the Move -a-thon and with our soccer game. There was great school spirit with the entire school outside cheering on the two teams.

The 8th Annual Poplar Bank Smoothie Day is a clear sign we're almost at the end of the school year. A group of parents arrive at the school with their blenders to prepare and deliver healthy smoothies to every classroom. This year we used 131 bananas, 10 kg of strawberries, 16 kg of berries, 18 kg of yogurt, 2L of rice milk and 2L of soy milk! A great treat as the days get warmer and a reminder school is almost over.

We look forward to a new year in September with opportunities for parents to serve on council, or as volunteers with some of our other initiatives. Our first council meeting in September is Thursday September 26. All parents are welcome.
