## Spring Provincial Testing Update: EQAO

In a few short months, our grade 3 and grade 6 students will take part in the provincial EQAO testing. Students in grade 3 French Immersion write only the mathematics subtest, which is given in French. Students in grade 6 complete three subsets, namely reading, writing and math in English. ## Eco News - Reduce, Reuse \& Recycle



On Wednesday, February $28^{\text {th }}$, the 'Capitaines de l'environment' led the Eco-Ambassadors in a Water Taste Challenge.

Many students found that tap water tasted better, or that they couldn't tell the difference. Tap water is safer than bottled water as its strictly regulated by Health Canada's Water Quality \& Health Bureau. It's fresher than the plastic bottles that can sit in their plastic containers for months. One of the biggest problems about single use bottled water is that $\mathbf{9 0 \%}$ are not recycled, ending up in landfills and in our oceans. The whole Eco-Team signed pledge certificates to choose to drink tap water instead of bottled water. Try the challenge yourself at home!


The school will be celebrating Earth Hour on Friday March $23^{\text {rd }}$, with our annual "Lights Out" Campaign. Everyone is invited to celebrate the day at home on the official day of Saturday March $24^{\text {th }}$ from $8-9 \mathrm{pm}$. ## Learning Commons/Carrefour d'apprentissage!

The focus this month in the Learning Commons/Carrefour d'apprentissage has been the introduction of the "Forest of Reading/ Forêt de la lecture" programme. As a bit of background information, the Forest of Reading ${ }^{\circledR}$ is Canada's largest recreational reading program! This initiative of the Ontario Library Association (OLA) offers eight reading programs to encourage a love of reading in people of all ages. The students and I are thoroughly enjoying reading high quality, children's literature. Primary students are participating in the Prix Peuplier read—alouds of French books written by Canadian authors. Follow-up activities are always planned and students are encouraged to participate actively. Mme McGraw's Grade 3 students have even created passports to track their journey through the 10 books we are exploring together.

Students in Grades 4-8 also have the opportunity to participate in the Prix Tamarac, the Prix Tamarac Express and The Red Maple Award (Grades 7 and 8). Students independently read a minimum of 5 books, thus allowing them to vote for their favourite books (fiction and non-fiction), from a selection of the best Canadian books written in French or English. Discussions often ensue, promoting critical thinking as well as respectful differences of opinion!


While this is happening, students are continuing to enjoy using the Learning Commons/Carrefour d'apprentissage throughout the day. The space is used to work, read while pedaling on the station-
 ary bicycle, play cooperative games and let their imagination soar.
