Students in grade 3 French Immersion write only the Mathematics subtest, which is given in French. Students in grade 6 complete three subsets, namely reading, writing and Math in English. Warm Weather is Here! Dress Code



This past month was so exciting: on Earth day, we presented our annual Eco Projects. We had fantastic presentations that included Power-Point presentations and energetic, interactive games. With the help of the wonderful student photographer, Kaylah C., we were able to capture these wonderful presentations for our year-book.



Did you know that Walmart is recycling plastic bags? For Earth Week, we participated in

their Plastic Grab Bag contest, in hopes of collecting the most plastic bags. We collected over 5000 plastic bags, almost all of the classes participated. The winning class was Mme. McGraw's class with an amazing 1024 bags. In second place was Mme. Cooper's class with a fantastic 1004 plastic bags. And the third place winning class was Mme. Kendall's class coming in with 837 plastic bags. The bags are chopped up and melted into plastic pellets that are then used to make things like decks and walkways. Please continue to reuse or recycle your plastic bags...or better yet, use reusable cloth bags.

In June, the Eco Team will be going to **Round the Bend Farm** with the Healthy Schools for a **Farm to Table** field trip. We are lucky enough to have the chance to actually plant and harvest food ourselves. We will also get a chance to interact with the animals there: collecting eggs and meeting with a bee keeper to learn about the bees' important role in our food production.

We are excited to announce that we have applied for a school greening grant to establish a student garden in partnership with the Healthy schools team. We are planning to use the garden to grow our own food for our crunchy munchy bins.

How to access and register for Continuing Education courses:

- 2. Login in by entering your username (YORK-XXXXXXXX where XXXXXXXX is your 9-digit student number). When logging in for the first time, the password will be the student's birth date using the format mmddyyyy. The system will prompt the student for a new password after successfully logging in the first time.
- To retrieve a lost password, click on the words "Forgot my username and/or password" found under the login box.
