Reading Tips



Before Reading

- Before you read the book, take a few minutes to talk

about the front cover and the title of the story.

- Remind him or her of a time they had an experience

like the one in the book.

- For early readers, take a picture walk through the story. Look only at the pictures and talk about what they see.

- Remember we are reading for meaning so it is important to understand the context of the story.

During Reading

-Let your child hold the book and ask them to read. -Notice and praise him or her for all of the attempts and the wonderful skills they are using whenreading this new book.Be supportive and positive and offer help when

they

need it.

After Reading

-It is important to talk about the story.

-try retelling the story

-relating the story to your own experience

-talk about vocabulary that you found in the book

-think of a new ending for the story

-make yourself a character and describe what would you have done in that case.

This important time spent reading together will help your child discover the world of reading and help foster a love for it!

Punctuality Counts! Punctuality is an important life-skill valued by school, employers in the workforce, and society. We continue to experience a number of students arriving late for school. The morning bell rings at 8:00 a.m. and classes begin sharp at 8:05 a.m. Students who walk to school or who are driven to **School Safety Procedures & Reminders:**

Reporting to the Office: Whenever a parent or visitor comes to the school, he or she **must always** come directly to the office. If a parent, grandparent or caregiver needs to drop something off for a student, we will take the item and call the student from class or the yard to meet the parent, grandparent or caregiver in the office. Parents, grandparents and caregivers are not to go into the school halls/classrooms or yard to meet students. This causes unsafe conditions as only school staff have access to those areas during the school day. All other people are considered to be strangers. Please share this with your child's grandparents, other relatives and caregivers. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Unsafe Crossing of our Bus Loop: We

continue to see students and parents walking through the North bus loop both before and after school. We need your help in stopping this unsafe practice. When dropping off or picking up your child, please reinforce with him/her to use the sidewalks off Bonshaw adjoining the school property. It is an unsafe practice to cross between parked busses or walk through the bus loop and this must stop immediately. Thank you for helping us keep all students safe.

Safety and Dogs on School Property: Dogs are wonderful members of the family; however for safety reasons, dogs are not permitted in the school building during the school day or after hours. Some people are afraid of dogs and some people are very allergic to dogs. Therefore, parents who wish to bring their child(ren) to school or pick up their child (ren) from school, and bring their dog along, are asked to have their pets on a leash, have them muzzled and wait outside the school building. This will prevent any accident from occurring between dogs and students, parents, school staff, and childcare staff on school property. We thank you in advance for your cooperation. school **must** be in class before the end of the respect songs. Otherwise, they are marked as late and this is recorded on their report card. Strategies to help students who are repeatedly late can include making up lost time or a letter to parents. Severe cases will be referred to Attendance & Counseling Services. Please ensure that your child arrives on time ready to learn.

Toys, Beyblades Walkmans, Cell Phones, MP3 Players,Gameboys, iPods. and Other Valuables:

We strongly discourage students from bringing these items to school as they can easily get broken, misplaced or stolen. They also become the cause of arguments. Should students bring these items to school, they must remain in their backpack and not be taken out in class or put in their desks. We are not banning these items at this time, but students need to understand that if they bring them to school, they do so at their own risk.

Student Safety in the School Yard

Please note that supervision in the school yard begins at **7:50 am** and after school, supervision ends at **2:45 pm**. **Parents are asked not to drop off their children before 7:50 am**. After school, students who walk home must be sure to leave school property and go directly home. This will help prevent unsafe situations from arising in and around school property.

Snowballs: Now that the snowy weather is here, we need to remind all students that we enjoy the snow, we play in it, we make snowmen and even snowforts, but we do not throw or kick snow. Students who throw snowballs or kick snow will receive immediate consequences. There are no warnings. Please counsel your child(ren) that throwing and kicking snow can results in serious injury to others and is not allowed.

Students Staying Indoors While III:

Frequently we receive requests from parents to allow a child to remain indoors at recess or lunch hour due to illness or a cold. Unfortunately, we cannot accommodate these requests. We have no staff to supervise these students; all our supervisors are in the school yard. It is our belief and the recommendation of the York Region Health Services, that students who are too ill to go out for recess are too ill to come to school. The only time students are permitted to stay in at recess times or lunch hour occurs when Environment Canada announces severe winds and cold Conditions.

Eco News

Poplar Bank Public School is an Eco-School and there are teams of students responsible for Energy Conservation, Schoolyard Greening, and Waste Management.

October's Eco-theme was "Lights Out!" On a daily basis, the Energy Team has been monitoring the use of lights in the school. At lunch hour, these students check every classroom and office to verify if there is full lighting, reduced lighting or no lighting when the rooms are not in use. At the end of each month, the team will produce a bar graph indicating the decreased use of lighting for the entire school. The Energy Team encourages everyone to remember to leave the lights off if there is enough natural light during the day, or to turn off the lights when leaving a room. Our goal is to conserve energy.

The Schoolyard Greening Team has planted a variety of donated plants around the stone school sign near the entrance of the building, as well as at the rock circle/outdoor classroom. Each grade level has been assigned a month of the school year for yard clean-up to ensure that PBPS stays green.

To help reduce waste, all students at PBPS are encouraged to continue to bring litterless lunches to school. They must also use the correct disposal units (green bin, recycling bin, garbage). Signs are posted in all classrooms near the bins. The caretaking team is an important part of Waste Management, and we thank them for their efforts!

The Eco-Schools website offers a number of suggestions for students to celebrate the environment. Friday, October 25th, was designated "Get Outside Day"

and all classes at PBPS were encouraged to spend time outdoors for DPA, a Phys Ed class, Science lesson, yard cleanup, etc. Participation in these special days will help PBPS gain points for its Eco-certification. Keep up the good "green" work PB

Inclement Weather Emergency Conditions:

The cold weather season is just around the corner. We would

like all parents to be aware of the following bad weather procedures followed by the York Region District School Board. If the road conditions force the cancellation of the school buses, local radio stations will be notified as soon as possible, normally no later than 6:30 a.m. During severe weather conditions, please tune in to one of the radio stations listed below for up-to-date information. Remember that buses are cancelled in the morning then the buses will not be operating in the afternoon. Therefore, if you drive your children to school in the morning you must also be able to provide transportation for them after school at 2:35 p.m. Radio stations that will be notified of bus cancellations are: CFTR 680, CKEY 590, CFRB 1010, CHFI 98.1 and CKAN 1480. You have the right, as a parent, to keep your child(ren) at home in severe weather conditions; however, the school will probably be opened even though transportation has been cancelled.



School Bus Cancellation Notice

On occasion service cancellation due to inclement weather conditions may be required.

To ensure all education partners (staff, parents and students) understand how they can be informed of any service cancellation, please take the appropriate steps to distribute the attached **School Bus Cancellation Notice**.

Suggestions for sharing the information include but are not limited to:

- Sending copies home with students;
- Sending copies home in Report Card envelopes;
- Including notice in school newsletters and/or websites.
- · Posting Notice in appropriate locations (hallways, staff rooms);

A decision to cancel school bus transportation will be **region-wide** meaning all buses, vans and taxis will not operate.

Parents, students and school staff are asked to access local radio and television stations after 6:00 a.m. to receive bus cancellation information. A bus cancellation message will also be available at <u>www.schoolbuscity.com</u> and 1-877-330-3001 or by following the YRDSB on Twitter.

Please note that school bus charters will not operate when regular home to school service is cancelled.
