Online Kindergarten Registration

Children who turn four or five years old during 2019, live within the school boundary and whose parents are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for kindergarten.

Tobogganing and Sledding Safety

Tobogganing and sledding are fun, popular winter activities; however, every year hundreds of children are injured on toboggans. Here are some tips to keep your children safe:

- Parents should always actively supervise children at the toboggan/sled hill
- Dress children in warm layers of brightly coloured, waterproof clothes and boots. Use a neck warmer instead of a scarf and cover children's heads, ears and hands
- Teach children to toboggan/sled down the middle of hill and use the sides to walk to the top
- To prevent head injuries, children should always wear a hockey or ski helmet designed to protect the head in all directions in icy conditions
- Toboggans/sleds should be sturdy, easy to control and in good condition
- Remind children to sit on a toboggan/sled face forward and not lay on their stomachs; never allow children to sled head first
- · Choose a hill with a gentle slope and enough room to stop. The hill should be free of hazards (such as trees and rocks) and be well lit to see any potential dangers as well as to be seen by others
- Remind children to never jump in front of toboggans/sleds going downhill
- Make sure only the recommended number of children ride the toboggan/sled

Questioning in Math

Using effective questions when talking about math, supports the development of your child's mathematical reasoning. The use of questioning provides children with opportunities to share and clarify their ideas, draw conclusions, and explain and explore new strategies. With good intention, we often rush to provide our children all the information they need to solve a math problem. By giving your child this information too quickly, they may not think deeply about the problem or engage in <u>mathematical processes</u>.

Here is a list of questions you can ask to support your child's mathematical thinking:

- How did you solve the problem? What did you do?
- What strategy did you use? How did you estimate what the answer could be?
- What would happen if ...? Tell me what is the same? What is different?
- How do you know? How did you know where ...?
- How did you know which ...? How did you know when ...?
- How do you know your/our answer is reasonable?
- Would this work every time? Can you/we think of any examples that don't work?
- Have you/we found all the possibilities? How do you/we know?
- What have you/we discovered about _____ while solving this problem?
- What have you/we learned?

Activities: Primary/Junior - Math Before Bed

On <u>Math Before Bed</u> there are a variety of images that promote mathematical thinking. Show your child an image and ask them "what do you notice? what are you wondering about?". This promotes mathematical thinking - and then you can have them investigate one of their wonderings and come up with a solution. What a great time to ask them the guestions above to really uncover what they are thinking!!

Our Grade 3/4 students enjoyed a day at LEGOLAND where they used their imagination with educational play and participated in hands-on learning throughout the curriculum.




Our students enjoyed intramural floor hockey during the lunch hour, led by Mrs. Bechberger and Mr. Raddar.
