MATH AT HOME AND SCHOOL

Do you have **LEGO blocks** at home? What is the *tallest* Robot Monster that you can make using one head, one body and one set of legs?

What is the *shortest* one you can make using one head, one body and one set of legs? How about creating a monster with *2 heads and 4 legs*?

Here are some other fun ideas that can be quickly used at home to support our Math curriculum learning:

- cooking together (focus on counting, fractions, measuring, etc.)
- patterning with naturally found items outside (for example making

patterns with leaves - different attributes such as colour and size)

carving shapes on pumpkins (geometric properties of 2D shapes

i.e., name the shape, discuss how many sides, vertices, types of angles)

- sorting candy (healthy vs. not healthy, colour, kind of candy)
- **graphing candy/gummies/rainbow goldfish crackers**

HEALTH AND SAFETY at HALLOWEEN

The provincial government recently updated their list of symptoms related to Covid protocols and decision making about children attending school. When assessing for the symptoms, you should focus on evaluating if they are new, worsening, or different from your child's baseline health status or usual state. Symptoms associated with known chronic health conditions or related to other known causes/conditions should not be considered unless new, different or worsening according to the examples in the MOH chart. After developing symptoms, in general, children should no longer have a fever and their symptoms improving to be able to return to school/child care. Mild symptoms known to persist in young children (e.g. runny nose or mild cough that may persist following infections) may be ongoing at time of return to school/child care if other symptoms have resolved. The full Ministry of Health update is attached to this newsletter. You are also encouraged to speak with a family health care professional.

This year based on the many COVID safety and sanitizing practices, and some of the recent concerns expressed by the provincial health professionals, we are making a change to what we would normally be doing to recognize Halloween. A separate letter to this affect was sent recently to all families. On Friday October 30, we are asking parents to consider alternatives to the usual costumes such as **wearing black and orange clothing** or **crazy hair day**. And we ask that parents <u>not send students to school with any treats</u>.

We do realize that students may still choose to wear a simple costume with a reminder that all of the expected Health regulations remain in place. On October 30 we will be sharing some fun fall-themed art activities so there will be something for everyone!



Our crossing guard is on duty each day before and after school during our regular bus times. Parents are asked to drop their child off on the west side of the street and then escort them to the crosswalk. Staff are always on duty when buses arrive and as students enter the school property.


