Confidentiality

Parents/Guardians, please note activities throughout the that school year may require the use of student names, age, grade, etc., and while notices will be sent for most events, parents are welcome to discuss anv restrictions they require with the school principal. The Consent to Post Student Information on the Internet form is in the School Start-Up Package.



Medication

Please remember that students are not allowed to carry medication at school. Epi Pens and puffers are the only exception due to life-threatening reasons. If your child requires medication on a daily basis, you need to fill in a form entitled 'Administration of Medication'. The office staff will keep the medication locked in the office and administer during the lunch break. All medications must be in a bottle from the pharmacy clearly stating the child's name and dosage.

Two Epi-Pens are required at school and for all school outings. <u>One Epi-Pen must be carried on the students person at all times.</u>

SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

Every morning we contact the parents of students who are absent from school and for whom we have had no prior notification.

If you know that your child is going to be absent for a medical appointment etc., please contact the school by note or phone call the day before. This reduces the number of calls we have to make to parents (often interrupting them at work).

If your child becomes ill overnight, please leave a message on the school voicemail system which is accessible 24 hrs a day. Thank you for your diligence!

For the safety of our students and staff, ALL VISITORS AND VOLUNTEERS must report to the office and sign-in. If you are picking up your child from school early please wait at the Office while a staff member calls your child from class. Visitors and volunteers working in the school must wear a visitor's or volunteer's badge which is available at the office when you sign-in.

All volunteers must complete a Vulnerable Sector Screening Form (Criminal Background Check) through the York Region Police specifically for the YRDSB (or an Annual Offence Declaration Form if you are a returning volunteer that has a VSS form on file with the school).

Lunchtime Procedures



According to the York Region District School Board Policy 335.0, "Students are encouraged to go home for lunch wherever the length of the lunch hour and distance makes it practical." The exercise and the break from the school are viewed by the school as beneficial to students.

At Queensville Public School, students will need to be signed out by an authorized adult. Please inform the office of individuals who may sign your child out at lunch. Students must have prior written permission from a parent/guardian to leave school property during the lunch hour.

It is recognized that many of our students need to have lunch at school regularly and others on an occasional basis. To accommodate these needs, the school has School Assistants who supervise the students during this time. We also have students from our Grade 5/6 class who have volunteered to be Lunch Monitors in our younger classes.

Students are reminded of appropriate lunchtime behaviour including speaking to Lunch Assistants, and each other with respect, displaying proper manners, using an indoor voice, and staying in their seats while eating.

For students who leave school property at lunchtime, it is expected that they will go home for lunch and return to school before the end of lunch recess, they will be ready in class on time, and they will not bring food into the school to be finished in class after instructional time begins again.

Thank you to the QPS School Council for providing each student in Grade 1-6 with an Agenda Planner! We appreciate your understanding and support of the importance of home-school communication.

Protecting Student Privacy Under the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act

Student Bussing Eligibility

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your child's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. The provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680 are:

- •All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are <u>not eligible</u> for transportation.
- •All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are <u>not eligible</u> for transportation.
- •Students are <u>not guaranteed space</u> on school busses where a sibling is eligible for transportation.

Students are not permitted to ride any bus, other than the bus they are assigned to.

We are excited to announce that we will continuing to use the "Zones of Regulation" to help students learn to Self-Regulate..

Using the "Zones" approach teaches students how to express how they are feeling and how to regulate their emotions and behaviour using common language with staff, each other and School Assistants. You may even hear your child using the language of the Zones at home!

It is a non-threatening and effective way to help students gain awareness of how they are feeling, and to begin to rely on themselves to develop a "toolkit" of strategies that can help provide insight into events that trigger certain feelings and behaviours, calming strategies and problem solving skills.
