For each student we work towards a focus on critical thinking in literacy, safe and supportive schools, and numeracy with real life applications. This is the work we are committed to each day.

It is with great pleasure that we acknowledge the care and commitment of our entire staff: our teachers who have set up their classrooms to be inviting, child-centred and caring places to learn and grow; our office staff who complete many tasks that may go unnoticed but are critical to safe arrival, attending to sick children, registering for school or transitioning to high school; our Educational Assistants and DECEs who work as partners with teachers to support student learning in a variety of settings, both in and out of the classroom; our lunchtime School Assistants who assist a great deal with supervision over the lunch hour and help enforce our school policies around school visitors and lunch routines; and last, but not least, our caretaking team who work to ensure that classrooms, lockers, carpets, washrooms, the library, gymnasium and playground areas are safe and ready to meet students and families each day. Our school results for EQAO have been reported. The following results indicate the percentage of participating students achieving at or above the provincial standards: It is important to note that the school scores provided are for all students. These scores include the students who did not participate in the assessment for various reasons (absent, Special Education or Stage One English Language Learner). The scores for participating students (all those that participated in the assessment) are as follows: At or above Provincial Standard-Grade 3: Reading 100%, Writing 76%, Math 60% At or above Provincial Standard-Grade 6: Reading 90%, Writing 95%, Math 57% To view samples of student work and to understand what work at each level looks like, visit the EQAO Web site, www.eqao.com.

Our staff is closely examining our assessment data, particularly EQAO results from the spring and classroom reporting data gathered. We are delighted to see how we have maintained our Literacy scores in Reading and Writing at level 3 and 4. We have identified and are determined that Mathematical Literacy will continue to be a strong focus for this year. Our Math Night with School Council last spring was very successful which supported our daily work. Current math teaching strategies and teacher professional development will continue this year, to meet our goals set out in our school improvement plan to improve student achievement in mathematics.

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As you know, life at Ramer Wood Public School is not just about reading, writing and arithmetic; we pride ourselves on offering programs that encourage our students to think for themselves and to prepare for life beyond the classroom walls. Student participation is one of the ways we accomplish this goal. Our Terry Fox School Walk/Run last month, was also a great success as everyone enjoyed time outside together while listening to messages organized by Mr. Morrison with snacks from our snack program and School Council. This year we reached our goal of raising \$2,200.00 for the Terry Fox Foundation and would like to thank you for your generosity and support to the Terry Fox Foundation! We look forward to offering our students several learning experiences, special presentations, trips, Spirit days, sports etc..., allowing our students to experience the world at our door step!

EQAO Results

This month, parents and guardians will receive their child's Individual Student Report (ISR). This report contains their child's results from the Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary and Junior Divisions, administered in spring 2019. These results did not impact students' report cards last year.

EQAO results offer an independent snapshot that shows whether students are meeting literacy and math expectations from *The Ontario Curriculum*. In receiving the ISR, there is an opportunity for parents and guardians to have discussions about their child's achievement within their family or with a teacher (e.g., parent/guardian-teacher interview).

EQAO data should be considered alongside other information—such as in-class assessment results, report-card grades and teacher observations—so parents and guardians can build a fuller understanding of their child's learning.

We will continue to have Lockdown and Hold & Secure Practices in the weeks ahead.

- Do not ask your child to walk between cars to get to you/ or exit the car and walk between cars to get to the sidewalk
- If you don't see your child waiting, please park in the school parking lot or neighboring street, and meet your child at your child's entry/exit door
- Please respect staff on duty at all times

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News from the School Library

Good News! Students are borrowing books once again from the Ramer Wood Library.

The pleasure of reading a good book from the library is one that can be enjoyed over and over again by all of our students. To ensure that every child is able to select from the entire collection, we ask that you help us by supporting the following library policies:

- Students are allowed to check out two library books for two weeks. Often students in the primary grades check out one book at their reading level and one book that is their choice.
- If students have books that are overdue, lost, or damaged, they will not be
 able to sign out any more library books. Overdue books must be returned and
 lost or damaged books must be paid for before any more books can be signed
 out to a student.
- Each student has been given a plastic, zip-lock book bag. Please use this
 bag to bring library books home and back to school. This will help protect the
 books from damage.

After clicking on York Region District School Board, you will need to enter your child's student number with a zero in front of it.

Dressing Appropriately for the Weather

As the weather changes, it becomes very important that children arrive at school dressed appropriately for the weather. Warm hats, mitts, gloves, coats and waterproof boots are the regular dress during the late fall and winter months. If your children walk to school, bright coloured and reflective pieces of clothing help make them visible to motorists and traffic.

Children go outside for morning and lunch recess. When children are dressed for the weather, they are able to enjoy the activities outside during the colder months. Dressing in layers helps students to regulate their temperature. We always monitor the weather and, in extreme conditions (e.g., wind chill), we keep the students indoors or shorten recess breaks.



Creating Safe and Healthy Schools for Children with Allergies & Medical Conditions

School staff, parents and guardians are responsible for creating safe and healthy environments for students. This is an additional challenge for schools attended by children with allergies, especially life threatening allergies and medical conditions. While it is impossible to create a risk-free environment, school staff, parents and guardians can take important steps to minimize potentially fatal allergic reactions as there are implications for the whole school, not just individual classrooms.

Please do not send in any food to your child's classrooms. All special event days will be taken care of by our snack program and School Council. We are determined to be respectful of all our students who have allergies and medical conditions.
