Treasurer's Report (Presented by Sandra Aldcorn, on behalf of Jamie Aldcorn who could not attend the meeting)

Cash Available: \$5,600 not counting the o/ \$150 that has not come out yet (can spend approx. \$3000)

Main driver = pizza (winter was down revenue, but Spring only down 10 slices from Fall number)

Teacher Proposals:

Mr. Morrison

Requested < \$200, Council approved \$300 to cover the following

- 1. Implement a "wood-working" maker space in his kindergarten classroom (mitre box & saw, hammers, nails, etc.). Sandra suggested writing a letter to the local Home Depot to see if they would consider donating anything in addition to what can be purchased with council funds
- 2. Sticklets: Rubber device with 3 holes (can make tripods) 18 pieces for \$60
- 3. 2 way viewers: put an insect in it and you can view it from different angles (requested 2, council suggested and approved 5 of these)

4. Outdoor Chalkboards (laptop chalkboards) – in winter, whiteboard markers don't work. \$37.95/10

Mr. Hunter

Would like to take a Math PD over the summer – Cost is \$500 USD, Ms. Paterson suggested that the council consider covering a portion. **Council approved \$200 CAD** contribution

Ms. Milroy

3 plastic tables for outdoor space (similar to what was spent by school for Mr. Morrison's outdoor space). Council approved \$300

Council suggested that we also send out letter to parents asking for donation of more used tables

S.T.E.A.M. night Update

Incredibly successful – good turn out (at least 230-250 people came) Great feedback

As part of grant request we had committed to completing exit surveys, with we forgot to do. Bindu to put together 3 questions and send to Jane to send out to the community via email (include in News & Events Section of next newsletter).

Requested items from community:

Mr. Morrison is looking for any donations of old technology (things the kids can take apart) – eg. Old computers.

Jane's concern is with storage of too much junk. Jane will ask for specific donations (eg. Little Tykes picnic tables in good shape)

Pro-Grant proposal for next year is due June 5, 2018 (Jane might reach out to Patty O'Sullivan). Potential grant ideas for next year: do another STEAM Night – would allow us to learn from this year and re-use materials & build on it

Decided to apply for similar STEAM night and build on it – try to include the community (eg. People in the community that could run some of the activities. MaryAnn volunteered her husband who is an engineer).
