#### Kindergarten Registration

#### Kindergarten Registration Documents required for registration include:

- o Proof of child's age (birth certificate/ passport)
- Proof of residency (for child and parent/guardian) such as tax bill, utility bill, or bank statement
- Citizenship and immigration status (for child and parent/guardian where applicable)
- o Direction of school support form (this is available at registration)

#### Who can register?

Children born in 2013 are eligible for Junior Kindergarten this September. Children born in 2012 and not currently enrolled in public school can register for Senior Kindergarten in September (if your child is *already* attending JK, you do not need to reregister for the fall).



#### Student Busing Eligibility

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:



All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.



#### STUDENT PLACEMENT PROCESS 2016-2017

Our primary goal at Red Maple Public School is to develop balanced classes. A balanced class reflects the diversity of our community and allows the variety of interests and talents of our learners to emerge and be appreciated. Like your family, the class unit provides a balance of opportunities for a range of learners to succeed through appropriate challenges. The learner develops the feeling of belonging and the feeling that in a variety of ways he/she makes a noticed contribution. The family, the school and the community provide opportunities for children to socialize. Each new year brings opportunities to meet new friends and expand our circle of acquaintances. School becomes more comfortable and familiar and accordingly our potentials have great

possibilities of realization. The following are the criteria we use to guide our placements:

#### Balance of Ability, Interests and Talents

All children are unique and different. The teacher's task of providing meaningful learning programs is enhanced when classes are created to accommodate instructional groupings.

#### Balanced According to Gender

We attempt to balance the number of boys and girls to ensure many friendship opportunities.

#### Learning Style

How does the learner go about the process of learning? What kind of environment allows that style to be utilized effectively?

#### Teaching Style

How does a teacher go about the teaching/learning process? What type of learners might best flourish with this teacher?

#### Social Blending

What is the best cluster of individuals to effectively and efficiently learn? This should not be viewed as a grouping of friends. At particular stages, some close friends learn best in separate classes.

#### Parent Requests

A number of additional considerations are included in our decision making when creating classes. Regrettably, we are unable to accept specific teacher requests for the 2017-2018 year. Rather than suggesting a teacher, please indicate the learning style or classroom structure which would be most appropriate for your child. When teachers get together to create new class lists, we will use this information to help make our final decisions. Should you have information to share with us, please send a letter to Ms. Zarif by May 1st. The staff at Red Maple care deeply about student needs. Years of meeting the learning needs of children give them the unique qualifications to recommend placement decisions. It takes hours of discussion, reflection, revision and consideration of alternatives to arrive at the best organization for our school. Rest assured that the organization will include our best opportunities for student achievement.
