Message from our Trustee

With report cards coming home, this is a good time of year to review your child's progress and to set goals for the rest of the school year.

As trustees, our goals are set out in the Board <u>Multi-Year Plan</u>. In the coming months, trustees will be reviewing and updating this plan. This process will include opportunities for public input, and trustees will be out in the communities talking about this. More information will be shared about this in the spring.

Developing and reviewing the Multi-Year Plan is just one of our responsibilities as publicly elected officials. Trustee responsibilities also include hiring the Director of Education, setting <u>Board policies</u> and the <u>annual budget</u>, and communicating with the public.

This is a good time to learn more about the <u>role of trustees</u> with the next <u>municipal election</u> taking place later this year on October 22, 2018. York Region District School Board has <u>12 trustees</u>, elected by ratepayers. As a trustee, listening and communicating with families is an important part of my role. Students, families and members of the public are welcome to attend and observe any public Board, Advisory or Board Committee meetings and to share their views with us on policy and Board governance.

As we move into the second half of the year, I hope that you are seeing evidence of your child's learning and progress, and finding opportunities to get involved in their learning and the life of the school.

TERM ONE REPORT CARDS

Research shows that students need to learn more than just facts if they want to succeed in post secondary education and the world of work. Ontario's students are also learning to take initiative, work independently, be self-reliant and work in a team. Schools are teaching critical thinking and problem solving skills in order to give your child the ability to seize every opportunity for jobs and growth in the changing economy. The report card reflects this and emphasizes the importance of learning skills and work habits in your child's progress.

When evaluating subject areas, as always, teachers look at assignments, tests, presentations, and projects for evidence that your child is learning the curriculum. This learning means more than just knowing the facts. Students must also show an understanding of what they are studying by communicating and applying what they have learned. All assessments are reviewed with special attention given to the quality of work at the end of a unit of study or term. Teachers do not simply calculate averages. As well as looking at tests or assignments, they also talk to and observe your child in the classroom to gather as much information as possible before making a decision on the final grade.

There are two distinct feedback sections to be returned to school: one each for student comments and parent comments.

A report card is a checkpoint in your child's learning and should be understood as just that. There is always room to grow and opportunity to learn. The communication of achievement, next steps, and learning for your child is always a partnership between school and home. Set goals together and always ensure that your child is part of the conversation. Parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher at any time throughout the year when there are questions or concerns.

PARKING LOT SAFETY

The safety of our students and staff are vey important to us; therefore, we ask for your support with dropping off and picking up your child(ren). Please obey the rules, follow the speed limit and drive slowly when entering our parking lot. It is important that we all work together to keep everyone safe.

The Kiss and Ride program is intended for parents who are dropping off or picking up their child(ren). It is NOT intended for individuals who want to leave their vehicle to walk their child(ren) into the school. If you want to accompany your child(ren), please park your vehicle in the south parking lot and walk your child (ren) to the schoolyard/kindergarten gate.

In an effort to make drop-off and pick-up orderly and safe, we ask that drivers respect the following rules:

- 1. Obey the road rules, crosswalks, and speed limits. Drive SLOWLY and be aware of your surroundings.
- 2. Have your child(ren) enter and exit the vehicle from the curb side of the loop (exit from the RIGHT side of the vehicle ONLY). Exiting from the driver's side of the vehicle is unsafe due to the cars driving through the bus loop.
- 3. Do not park your vehicle in areas with pylons.
- 4. The Kiss & Ride area is **one way** only.
- 5. Your child(ren) should have their backpack on their lap to enable them to exit the vehicle quickly.

NEVER LEAVE YOUR CAR PARKED, IDLING OR UNATTENDED, ESPECIALLY WITH CHILDREN INSIDE.

Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten Registration is on now!

Documents required for registration include:

- Proof of child's age (birth certificate/passport)
- Two pieces of proof of residency (for child and parent/guardian) such as tax bill, utility bill, or bank statement
- Citizenship and immigration status (for child and parent/guardian where applicable)
- o Direction of school support form (this is available at registration)

Who can register?

Children born in 2014 are eligible for Junior Kindergarten this September. Children born in 2013 and not currently enrolled in public school can register for Senior Kindergarten in September (if your child is *already* attending JK, you do not need to re-register for the fall).


Happy Chinese New Year! Gung Hay Fat Choy!
