

Indigenous Storyteller @ Redstone

In February, Redstone students and staff had the honour of hosting Isaac Murdoch, an indigenous storyteller. We all appreciated Mr. Murdoch's engaging storytelling and teaching. Here is a student reflection on the experience:

First Nations Story Teller - Issac Murdoch and Kate By: Samantha C.

Two weeks ago, Isaac Murdoch and his partner Kate, two First Nations peoples from different tribes, came to our school and shared a First Nations story with us. The story was told the same way in both tribes. The First Nations tribes passed on stories from generation to generation using oral communication. To this day, they still use this tradition.

The story that they shared with us, described the ice age, as well as the beginning of winter and summer. The moral of this story is about the value of sharing and kindness. It also talks about the consequences of greed. I think it is very important for all Canadians to learn more about First Nations culture and history, and I hope we will have more opportunities like this in the future.

Transportation Requirements

- Students in Grades JK-3 must live more than 1.2 km from the school to qualify for bussing.
- Students in Grades 4-8 must live more than 1.6km from the
 school to qualify for bussing.
 - This means that a student may have qualified in Grade 3, but no longer qualifies in Grade 4. It also means that a younger sibling may qualify while an older sibling may not.

Health Connections Eye Exams

Have your children had their eyes checked this year? All children are entitled to annual OHIP-covered eye exams until they turn 20.

With so much visual information presented in the classroom, children need clear vision to see, to process, to learn.

Did you know ...

- up to 80% of classroom learning is visual
- according to the Ontario Association of Optometrists, 25% of children have a form of vision problem
- only 19% of students under the age of six have had a comprehensive eye exam.

At Redstone Public School, we are proud to celebrate all cultures around the world, and this year we will be having an assembly to celebrate Newrouz with our students and community. We recognize that there are families in our community that celebrate the rebirth of spring, also known as Newrouz. Newrouz is celebrated by 300 million people around the world and it is a day that marks the New Year across parts of the Middle East, the Balkans, the Caucasus and Asia.

Newrouz begins at the stroke of the vernal equinox, when the sun crosses the equator. The exact moment of Newrouz is on the 20th of March varies depending on the exact calculation of when the length of the day and the night are equal. For 2018 the new Iranian year 1397 starts on Tuesday, March 20th at 12:28:40 pm (EST). Newruz can be spelled, Nowrouz, Nooruz, Navruz, Nauroz or Nevruz depending on the region. In the Persian language, Nowruz means No (new) and rouz (day). It means new day, symbolising new life, new beginnings. Every year, Nowruz coincides with the start of spring and traditionally celebrates the rebirth of nature. It also coincides with the spring equinox. When the equinox comes, millions of families of Iranian descent gather around a ceremonial table known as the Haftseen. Young and old hold hands and count down to the New Year together and cheer by wishing each other all the best or simply just mentioning Happy New Year! In every home, the Haftseen table is decorated with seven items since seven is considered a lucky number. Each item begins with the letter (S) in Persian, and each item is a symbol of spring and renewal, including:



Seeb - (apple), representing beauty
Seer - (garlic), representing good health
Serkeh - (vinegar), representing patience
Sonbol - (hyacinth), representing spring
Samanu - (sweet pudding), representing fertility
Sabzeh - (sprouts), representing rebirth
Sekeh - (coins), representing prosperity

Throughout the morning of March 22, 2018 the kindergarten classes will be participating in egg painting. Decorating eggs is a great way for children to be involved in the Newrouz preparation, where a coloured egg symbolizes fertility within the Persian culture.
