## Important Information for Parent Volunteers

York Region District School Board procedure requires that all parent volunteers who come to help out in the school (i.e., in the classroom, on trips, etc.) require a valid Police Check including the Vulnerable Sector Screening (VSS) along with a completed Offence Declaration form. Both forms will be kept in the school office and are in compliance with YRDSB procedure NP 280-Volunteers in our Schools.

#### Parents...Get Involved and Join the School Council!

The School Council acts as an advisory committee to the Principal and is actively involved in supporting the school. Meetings are held to discuss school plans, set goals and to provide advice to the school administration. All parents are welcome to attend School Council meetings. Please come out to the first meeting on Monday October 1st at 7pm in the library. If you are interested in serving on the 2018-2019 Redstone School Council, please complete the Self-Nomination Form which you will find in the "School Start Up Package". Deliver the completed form to the School Office by Friday September 21st. If we receive 15 or less nomination forms, the Council will be considered acclaimed and we will meet on Monday October 1st. If more than 15 nominations are received, an election to select members will be held. Ballots will be sent home on Thursday, September 27th (one per family) and can be to school by the latest by Friday, September 28th. New members will begin their term on Monday, October 1st at the School Council Meeting. At our first official meeting, elections will be held for the Executive positions: president, vice president, treasurer and secretary. Please join us!

#### Medication

Thank you to all parents who have promptly returned medical forms and medication for your child/ren. The Board policy states that those students who require an Epi-Pen carry their Epi-Pen on them in a "fanny pack" at all times during the day (as age appropriate). This also includes on the bus coming to school and going home. It is mandatory that the school office has an extra Epi-Pen that is kept in the health room. Parents are asked to bring the extra Epi-Pen to school as soon as possible along with the required medical forms completely filled out.

### **Allergies**

There are children and staff who have life threatening allergies. In order to ensure the health and wellbeing of these individuals, we have a Peanut/Nut Sensitive Policy in our school. We need the understanding and commitment of everyone in our community. Please take the time to read ingredient labels carefully. This will help to ensure that our students, staff and visitors remain free from exposure to nut products and help avoid the possibility of a medical emergency.

#### **Equity Alert – Food at School!**

Due to students with extreme food allergies and in fostering an equitable learning environment, no food products for birthdays as well as fast food purchases for lunch (i.e., McDonald's etc.) will be allowed into classrooms. Thank you for your cooperation and efforts at inspiring healthy eating habits for our children.

#### **Transportation**

Students in Grades JK-3 must live more than  $1.2\,\mathrm{km}$ . from the school to qualify for bussing. Students in Grades 4-8 must live more than  $1.6\,\mathrm{km}$ . from the school to qualify for bussing. This means that a student may have qualified in grade 3 but no longer qualifies in grade 4. It also means that one sibling may qualify and the other may not. Please check the website at schoolbuscity.com to verify bussing for your child(ren).

STSYR works closely with school bus operators to help ensure safe, reliable transportation is provided to students. Occasionally service times may be disrupted for various reasons.
