The grade 7 students recently attended the Vivian Outdoor Resource Center (VORC) and enjoyed seeing nature up close and personal, as they took part in The Amazing Survival Race.



This completely redesigned program

challenged students to think about how prepared they were to deal with a real emergency situation, such as a natural disaster, severe weather event (like our recent ice storm), or prolonged power outages. Teams of students raced across the Vivian property in their version of "The Amazing Race", trying to complete their own emergency kit before time ran out. Problem-solving and communication skills were emphasized and put to the test, and the grade 7's rose to the challenge!

The students will be introduced to the Canadian Government's "72 Hours Be Prepared" campaign, which encourages all Canadian families to construct a family emergency kit, and we encourage all families to have an open conversations about what to do in an emergency situation at home, and to start building emergency kits to be prepared should this occur.

Kindergarten Registration to Commence January 16, 2015

Kindergarten registration will commence on January 16, 2015 for the 2015-16 school year. Registration forms are available on YRDSB's website: <u>www.yrdsb.ca</u>. Children who turn four or five years old during 2015, live within the school boundary and whose parents are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for kindergarten. A kindergarten information session for parents is being planned for this spring. For more information please visit the YRDSB website or contact your local school.

French Immersion Information Sessions and Registrations

Information sessions for the French Immersion (FI) program will take place at Michaelle Jean P.S. on January 15, 2015 at 7 p.m. FI registration will begin January 16, 2015. In order to streamline the registration process, parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students entering Grade 1 in 2015, and wishing to enrol in the FI Program, can visit or call the school office and request an *Office Index Card - short version*. The Office Index Card must be signed by the principal of the home school. Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to [school name] to register between January 16 and February 13, 2015. This eliminates the need to provide duplicate enrollment information or to pre-register.

YRDSB's FI Accommodation Plan provides long-term consistency and equity of access to all students in York Region and will enable YRDSB to continue to offer the FI program to all who wish to enrol. The FI program will be offered in Dual Track or Single Track settings, in a variety of configurations. In order to meet community needs and optimize available space in our schools, a community's Grade 1-8 FI program may be provided over more than one school during the course of a student's FI education. This will allow flexibility in addressing community needs and the opportunity to use existing space in schools. More information is available on the Board's website: <u>www.yrdsb.ca</u>. Please note: Some of the FI accommodation plans will require facility modifications or the development of new schools and will require short-term transition plans that might include overflow while we work toward the long-term vision. Overflow refers to situations in which the Board directs students to attend a school other than their community school or optional program for a specific period of time, as defined in Policy #108.

Grade 3's Trip to Pioneer Village

The grade 3's travelled back in time to the pioneer days. They enjoyed a fun filled day living and learning about the life of a pioneer child. The students worked in the home - churning butter, cleaning the floors, dusting, baking and practicing cursive with a quill pen. They were busy in the workshop - carving spoons, weaving and drilling holes. It was also exciting to explore the village and discover what life was like! It was a great day and an excellent launch to our studies in class!

Students are required to bring skates and a CSA approved helmet. Please note that rental skates are <u>not</u> available at the rink. Parent volunteers are most certainly welcome to come for a skate and supervise students on the ice (and help tie and untie skate laces!).

For those students who do not currently own skates, used skates can be purchased at *Play It Again Sports* on Yonge St. at 16th Avenue. We also have a few pairs of skates at the school that have been donated that can be shared, or students may arrange to share skates that belong to a classmate. We would greatly appreciate any families that have old skates that no longer fit their children to please donate them to our school 'skate bank' for current and future students to use.
