Staff Report – Doug Inglis

Here are recent and upcoming academic, social, and extra-curricular school events:

1) Pink Shirt Day - Wed. Feb. 22/23

• Pink Shirt Day is a globally recognized day in support of anti-bullying, upstanding behaviour and simple acts of kindness. Pink Shirt Day began in 2007 when a Nova Scotia student was bullied for wearing a pink shirt to school. In a show of upstanding spirit, two students at the school purchased dozens of pink shirts and distributed them to their classmates to wear the next day. It has since been recognized annually worldwide as a day to stand up and speak out against bullying and homophobia. On February 23, 2022 and every day at Redstone, we continued to practice kindness and acceptance, with students and staff wearing pink to show that we do not tolerate any form of bullying.

2) Post-March Break Spirit Week

• March Break is coming (March 13-17), and we have some fun spirit week activities planned when the students return to school. Each day from Tuesday, March 21st on will be an inclusive and fun theme: Tues. - Rock your Socks Day (bright or mismatched socks in support of World Down's Syndrome Day; Wed. - Fun in the Sun Day (bright clothes, beach wear, sunglasses); Thurs. - Athletic Day (sports teams, jerseys, hats, team colours); and Fri. - Earth Day (celebrate Earth Day by wearing blue, green and/or brown)

3) Primary Play Day - Healthy Hearts and Minds - Tues. March 7

• Primary teachers have planned a morning of interactive and fun activities for our younger students in grades 1 - 3. The theme of the events will be a combination of mindfulness, wellness, inclusion, and fitness. Classes will rotate through a wide range of activities including cooperative gym games, scavenger hunts, karaoke, sledding, and a hot chocolate booth. We look forward to supporting our primary students in this fun event!

4) Author Visit - Wed. March 22/23

• Author Rishma Govani, parent of one of our intermediate students, has published a children's book *Sushi and Samosas*. It's a story of diversity and discovery, as a family explores foods from around the world to gain a better understanding of different cultures and to move beyond the routine of chicken nuggets. Ms. Govani will do a read-aloud to our primary/junior students and discuss how she turned her passion for food into the theme for her children's picture book.

5) Intermediate (Gr. 7 and 8) Basketball Tournaments

• Our intermediate boys won our first invitational tournament in 3 years on Feb. 9, defeating teams from William Berczy, Doncrest and Silver Stream P.S. They made their way to the finals again the following week, placing second to a strong team from Bayview Hill P.S. Congratulations to the boys and their coaches Mr. Grey and Mr. Stoddart. The girls' basketball team was to compete in their first invitational tournament of the year on Feb. 23 but the event was cancelled due to the storm. Both teams participated in the area tournaments at Red Maple P.S. on Tuesday (Feb. 28 - boys) and Wednesday (March 1 - girls). Out of the 10 teams in each tournament, the boys and girls' teams placed 3rd and 5th respectively. Way to go, Roadrunners!

6) February is Black History Month

 We continue to celebrate Black excellence in our schools and communities and recognize the achievements of Canadians of African and Caribbean descent through classroom learning activities and discussions. Display boards, both upstairs and down, are showcasing the many outstanding achievements of black Canadian and international figures, and Mr. Barwin's gr. 7 students are sharing profiles of trailblazers past and present on the morning announcements all month as well.

7) French Carnival-Week of Feb. 14 - 16

• Our French Carnaval was a big success this year, providing students in grades 4 - 8 with opportunities to practice their French communication skills while enjoying activities such as castle building, floor hockey, and a dance in the spirit of the real Carnaval de Quebec. Students also received a surprise visit from Bonhomme, the official Carnaval mascot!
