Staff Report – Doug Inglis

Here are recent and upcoming academic, social, and extra-curricular school events:

1) April is 'Celebrate the Spectrum' month for Autism

• In April, schools across Ontario learn about autism and how we can support all of our students on the autism spectrum. Our community class teachers Ms. Parolini and Mr. Saltzman have shared resources with staff on this year's theme of *Celebrate the Spectrum*, and our school-wide activity will be the *Infinity Tree*. Students are writing messages or drawing pictures on colourful paper in an infinity symbol of how they can show acceptance and understanding of neurodivergent people, with a focus on the phrase "Acceptance is an Action." The messages will be assembled into an 'Infinity Tree,' a creation to represent our collective

understanding and inclusion of people with autism. Students will also be making morning announcements about autism throughout the month, and there will be a special presentation at our character assembly in late April.

2) Redstone Gardening Club and 'Bloom Ka-boom!'

• Ms. Maizelis and Mr. Mangaloglu are leading a group of students in learning about plant life cycles, gardening, growing vegetables, and soil. The group will be planting seeds in the Redstone garden and tending to it weekly, as well as monitoring the growth and changes in the various flora. In addition, the 'Bloom Kaboom' initiative will take place again this year, in which all interested classes will create seed bombs under the guidance of Gardening Club members and collectively toss their seed pods (or 'bombs') into the ravine on a countdown on April 25. The seeds will disperse and naturally germinate and grow in the reservoir area.

3) Java and Python Workshops with Mobile Design Labs - Mon. April 17 and Tues. April 18

 Our grade 7 and classes will participate in 4 separate training sessions with Mobile Design Labs for computer programming languages: Java and Python. Students can choose which language they want to sign up to learn.

4) Character Assembly - Wed. April 26, period 3

• Our next character assembly will take place on Wednesday, April 26 in period 3 (11:10). We will be acknowledging the great character of students from each class, with a focus on the traits of fairness (March) and initiative (April). There will also be a special presentation by our Dance Team, led by Ms. Parolini.

5) VORC (Vivian Outdoor Resource Centre) - Fri. April 28

• Mr. Barwin's grade 7 class visits the outdoor education centre in Newmarket on Friday, April 28 for programs that support our science and social studies curricula. Their initially scheduled visit was canceled due to a snow storm earlier in the year.

6) Stay Driven - Spoken Word Presentation by Rapper Duane (D.O.) Gibson - Mon. May 1

• Duane Gibson is a Guinness World Record setting rapper, author, university graduate, and inspirational speaker. His one-hour presentation is called *Stay Driven* that combines speaking with live performance to engage students while delivering a solid message. This presentation to the school is in support of our mental health week initiative.
