Teacher Report – Doug Inglis

Here are recent and upcoming academic, social, and extra-curricular school events:

1) Terry Fox Foundation Fundraiser

• This year's event is back to a combination of cash donations and an online option, in the hopes of getting our students more directly connected to the event. Our goal is \$1200, and we are just past halfway, with one week remaining. Donations from Redstone families and staff are greatly appreciated. To wrap up the event, classes and their teachers will walk a 1 km route around the neighborhood on Thurs. Oct. 6 to celebrate our success and pay homage to a great Canadian, Terry Fox.

2) Safety Week – Sept 28 – Oct. 4/22

Safety Week provides an opportunity to practice proper safety protocols and draw attention to our roles in providing a safe learning and working environment. Safety Week is scheduled from Wednesday, September 28 - October 4. Activities that are taking place in classes and around the school include *Caring and Safe Schools* presentations, fire, lockdown and hold and secure drills, bullying and cyber-bullying information, and bus and bike safety.

3) Orange Shirt Day – Fri. Oct 30/22

 Orange Shirt Day is a national movement to recognize the experiences of Indigenous survivors of residential schools and to show our commitment to ensure that every child matters. Students and staff are encouraged to wear orange in support of both the movement and for Ms. Phyllis Webstad, a spokesperson and residential school survivor, whose new orange shirt was taken away from her as a child at residential school and became a symbol for the movement.

4) Character Matters/7 Grandfather Teachings Assemblies

 Redstone has always celebrated outstanding character in our students and staff. This year, we will return to whole-school assemblies in the gym to honour students who consistently demonstrate and model great character in and around the school. The character traits for September and October are courage and empathy and are taught in conjunction with the 7 First Nations Grandfather Teachings of bravery, honesty, humility, love, respect, truth and wisdom.

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5) Curriculum Night - Thurs. Oct. 13

Curriculum Night will be held on Thursday, October 13th, 2022 from 6:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. Teachers will meet parents and summarize the learning for the year, clarify classroom routines and expectations, and address general questions. There will be 2 sessions on the half hour for parents with more than one child at Redstone.

6) Food Drive for the Richmond Hill Community Foodbank

• Families, seniors, youth, and newcomers to Canada of all ages in our city depend on the services of the Richmond Hill Community Food Bank. Redstone will once again be supporting our local food bank with a food drive for the holiday. We are politely requesting donations of non-perishable food and personal care items to help others in need. This year's food drive will run from September 26 to October 6th. Students can bring food donations from home to their classrooms, and the staff of the foodbank will pick up the items in early October before the Thanksgiving long weekend.

7) Islamic Heritage Month

 October is Islamic Heritage Month. Resources will be shared with staff to educate themselves and their students on the history, culture, practices, and traditions of Islam, and information will also be shared on morning announcements daily.

8) VORC - Outdoor Education Field Trips

 Each year, select grades are chosen to participate in outdoor education programs that support our science and social studies curricula. As with many initiatives, we are returning to in-person, off-site visits to the *Vivian Outdoor Resource Centre* (VORC) in Newmarket. Our grade 2, 4 and 7 classes are scheduled to visit the centre in January.

9) Cross Country Running Team

• Students in grades 4 to 8 have been training on Tuesday and Thursday mornings under the direction of Ms. Cookson and Mr. Hynd. A team of 60 students will compete at the area meet at Richmond Green on Thursday, October 13, and those who place in the top 15 for their age group will move on to the regional competition on Tuesday, October 25 at Bruce's Mill Conservation Area.
