Cold Weather Policy

We have had some questions about the policy on extreme cold weather and indoor recesses. As per this board policy on <u>Severe Weather Conditions</u>, our students will continue to play outside throughout the winter. We will only have an indoor recess in conditions of extreme cold weather (temperature or wind chill of -20 C). Please have your children come to school with boots, snow pants, jackets, hats, and mittens, prepared to play outside.

Morning Drop-Off

Thank you for watching so carefully, signalling your intention, and keeping your speed down, during morning drop-off. We remind everyone that the Kiss and Ride lane is only for drop-off and that no one should park there. If you want to get out of the car to walk your child to the door, please find a parking spot. We will continue to work with the Tennis Club to discourage their members from using our parking lot during school hours. Please consider participating in Walking Wednesday. You might find that active transportation is almost as quick as driving, and much less stressful.

It would be greatly appreciated by our wonderful office staff if you would send your child's lunch to school with them in the morning. As we're sure you can appreciate, the items drop-off cart is primarily for emergency drop-offs and not to be used as a regular depository system.
