BOKS

We are pleased to announce the launch of **BOKS**, a free before school physical activity program, at Regency Acres Public School. BOKS prepares children for a day of learning and is an important step in helping children gain an appreciation of the benefits of exercise and healthy choices that will last a lifetime. BOKS was inspired by Dr. John Ratey's book "Spark". Dr. Ratey, of Harvard Medical School, states that "exercise is the single most powerful tool that we have to optimize the function of our brains." Classes are filled with teamoriented games and provide plenty of opportunity for play, since the program focuses on fun!

Typical BOKS Class

- § 30 minutes long
- § Fun warm-up game or movement drills
- § Running activity, relay races, obstacle courses and strength movements
- § Fun game
- § Cool down and a BOKS Bit nutritional talk

When is BOKS?

BOKS will run every WEDNESDAY from 7:30 - 8:00AM. Depending on weather, we will be either in the gym or outside. The session starts WEDNESDAY, APRIL 26th and the last day will be WEDNESDAY, JUNE 21st.

How do I sign up?

Permission letters will be sent home next week. Please have your child return the BOKS permission form to MRS. MOFFITT or MRS. THOMAS. A.S.A.P. (There is a limit of 25 students/session).

and remember. A past Regency teacher, Jennifer Burt, spearheaded this research, and Mrs. Moffitt's class named it Fit4Life. Following the yearlong fitness program, significant improvement in the students' school work, attendance, behaviour and self-esteem were noted by both Mrs. Moffitt & Ms. Thomas and most importantly by both the students and their parents. These positive results convinced the entire school to adopt these morning workouts. Since then, participation in the weekly run has grown from one class to over 10

classes, ranging from Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8. Our first Regency Run, for 2017, will take place on Tuesday, April 4th. It will continue, every Day 4, at 8:30 a.m. (weather permitting). Parents are welcome to join us as we continue to have fun and get fit **at** Regency. Interested classes, please meet outside by the Kindergarten Courtyard following morning attendance. Teachers will be running and walking along with Regency students. F.Y.I...My Grade 6/7s will run

alongside their Learning Buddies from Mrs. Carretta's class.

Pause to Play

The Pause to Play initiative is a way to celebrate and embrace physical literacy. It is a day devoted to developing the fundamental movement skills that all children need through a sport or activity that they perhaps have not yet been introduced to. We typically begin the day with the Regency Run, followed by a rotation of electives (chosen by students in advance). Activities offered on this day include cricket, karate, soccer, circus arts, basketball, yoga and playground time (to name a few). Our event relies on the generous contribution of volunteer time and skill set. Our Pause to Play day will take place on April 28th at various locations within the school and surrounding fields/park. 

an invitation, please contact Mrs. Sandiford or Mrs. Claus at the school so that we can make sure that your hard work and dedication can be acknowledged.




