Following the yearlong fitness program, significant improvement in the students' school work, attendance, behaviour and selfesteem were noted by both Mrs. Moffitt & Ms. Thomas and most importantly by both the students and their parents. These positive results convinced the entire school to adopt these morning workouts. Since then, participation in the weekly run has grown from one class to over 10 classes, ranging from Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8. Our first Regency Run, for 2018,

will take place on Tuesday, April 4th. It will continue, every Day 4, at 8:30 a.m. (weather permitting). Parents are welcome to join us as we continue to have fun and get fit at Regency.
