Grade 1 French Immersion Information Sessions and Registrations



Information sessions for Grade 1 entry into the French Immersion (FI) program will take place at French Immersion schools that have a Grade 1 program on January 17, 2019 at 7 p.m. Please visit VPDSR's website in January 2019 http://www.yrdsb.ca/Programs/fi/Pages/

Registration

FI registration will begin on January 18, 2019. Parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students entering Grade 1 in 2019, and wishing to enrol in the FI Program, can visit or call their home school office and request an *Office Index Card - short version*. This Office Index Card must be signed by the principal of the home school. Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to

the designated FI program location to register, between January 18 and February 8, 2019. Registration during this period is not first come, first served.

Late Registrations

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Late registrations are those submitted after February 8, 2019. Late registrations will be treated on a first- come, firstserved basis and will be considered subsequent to registrations received during the registration period should overflow be necessary.

Accommodation Plan

YRDSB's FI Accommodation Plan provides long-term consistency and equity of access to all students in York Region and will enable YRDSB to continue to offer the FI program to all who wish to enrol. The FI program will be offered in Dual Track or Single Track settings, in a variety of configurations. In order to meet community needs and optimize available space in our schools, a community's Grade 1-8 FI program may be provided over more than one school during the course of a student's FI education. Space requirements at some schools may mean that siblings are in different schools for primary dual track French Immersion programs due to differing grade structures. Like any of our schools across the Board, changes to school boundaries, and/or the accommodation model for the French Immersion program may need to be considered when new schools open, a school experiences enrolment growth, and program changes occur. This will allow flexibility in addressing community needs and the opportunity to use existing space in schools.

Please note: Some of the FI accommodation plans will require facility modifications or the development of new schools and will require short-term transition plans that might include overflow while we work toward the long-term vision. Overflow refers to situations in which the Board directs students to attend a school other than their community school or optional program for a specific period of time, as defined in Policy #108.

School Board Policy Regarding the Clearing of Snow and Ice



What are the main snow/ice clearance responsibilities that are to be undertaken by Caretaking staff?

The main responsibility of Caretakers is to maintain sidewalks, stairs, ramps, and entrance ways that are not serviced by contractors, as well as any defined paths or patches to accommodate students with mobility issues and/or general safety.

Maintenance by Caretakers includes snow blowing and/or shoveling, as well as the distribution of an "ice melt product or sand.

Caretakers can use "ice melt and/ or pickled sand to address <u>small</u> ice covered areas in the parking lot or other paved areas that may pose a risk to staff or students. Caretakers must not use "ice melt and/or pickled sand on any grassed areas.


Can Caretaking staff be asked to clear the entire paved playground area?

No. Such an undertaking puts both the Caretaking staff and equipment at risk. Snow blowing a few access paths to the field area and/or using salt/sand to create paths are more viable practices. Also, "ice melt and/or pickled sand may be used to address small ice-covered areas.

Can Caretaking staff be asked to salt or sand an entire paved playground area?

No. Salting of this magnitude creates a number of environmental concerns. Sand, when tracked into the building, acts as an abrasive on floors and can do significant damage

Please also note that if a path is cleared from The Town of Aurora Park land that leads to our school the school does not maintain the upkeep of it. If you are using this path to get to school please use with care.

Kennedy. Every year for the past number of years we have successfully applied to the Province for a "Parent Reaching Out (PRO)" grant. Unfortunately this year, the grants have been put on hold by the province, and as such we were not able to fund the speaker we had originally planned for. This led to some impressive scrambling on our part to still provide something to parents without incurring costs.

Ms. Leoni and Kathy Duncan attended the School Council Forum held by the Board. There we learned about the great level of feedback the board received from the community with respect to the Trustee's Multi-Year Strategic Plan 2018 – 2022. They received over 2,000 pieces of feedback through the 5 Town Hall meetings which were held across the Region as well as the online survey. The plan has identified four areas of priority based on the feedback received:

- Foster Well-being and Mental Health
- Build Collaborative Relationships
- Champion Equity and Inclusivity
- Empower Ethical Leadership

There was also a visioning night held at Dr. G.W. Williams Secondary School on November 7. The board is planning for the construction of a new secondary school which will be located at Bayview Ave. and Borealis Avenue in the north west portion of town. The current school will remain part of the board's property, but the school population will be transitioned to the new building for September 2023. There is a significant domino effect which is why we are hearing things such as Aurora High being closed to transfers after this year. The visioning session also included an opportunity for community input in to the features of the new school. The most recent secondary school built by the York Region Board is Bill Hogarth 5. S. in Markham which opened in 2017. The presentation included a virtual tour of this school, which shares many components anticipated for the new secondary school being constructed.
