Dear Regency Families,

One of our Regency values is GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP. *Growing to become a responsible member of a global community* are the words that our students wrote when they were asked to think about what they would like to see as the school's commitments. This sentence is reflected in our *Regency Pledge* (co-created by every student in our school). Our pledge is our school's touchstone and is proudly displayed in our front entrance (see at-

tached). Our staff spend a tremendous amount of time and work, daily, to promote respect for others and to encourage students to reflect on their impact on others and their influence in the world. We have many socially-conscious students, who want to help make this world a better place. Critical thinking skills are an important focus at school in every grade - they are seen as important skills for students to develop in order to evaluate situations, problem-solve and generate new ideas. One way of developing critical thinking skills is by analyzing media texts (ads, posters, brochures, magazines, news publications...).

Recent tragic events that have been highlighted in the news and on the radio are capturing the attention of the world. Many of our students are aware and some have questions about what they see and hear. Therefore, I feel a strong sense of obligation and responsibility to share my thoughts and offer supports for staff, students and parents.

Tragic events can exacerbate many reactions (positive and negative) and it is important that we take time to look after ourselves, our staff and our students. It is also important to recognize that our students will express their feelings in different ways. As teachers and parents, we can help children understand the importance of treating all people with dignity and not judging entire *groups* of people for the actions of a few. Most importantly, it is crucial that adults model compassion and acceptance of differences in their words and behaviour.

I hope the following <u>key messages</u> can serve as a resource for you (adapted from the National Association of School Psychologists, 2015):

- Groups of people should not be judged by the actions of a few. It is wrong to condemn an entire group of people by association of religion, race, homeland, affiliations, or even proximity. No one likes to be blamed or threatened for the actions of others.
- All people deserve to be treated with fairness, respect, and dignity. Certainly, individuals proven to be guilty of a crime should be punished. No matter how angry we are over these terrible crimes, our laws ensure fair and equitable treatment for everyone.
- *We are strong because of our diversity.* We respect individual differences. Those differences in culture, religion, ideas, ethnicity, and other forms of identity have contributed to the strength and richness of our schools and our community.
- Learn about the diverse communities and faiths represented in your area. Knowledge debunks myths about other people and can humanize other cultures. In school, have children share information about their family or cultural customs to reinforce the notion that all people have special beliefs and rituals.

Lets join together to make a difference. Difference starts with us so let's stand proud beside a "Canadian" identity that for many has meant a place of opportunity and new beginnings. Regency Acres as well as our local and broader school community receives new families each year and this acceptance of cultural and linguistic diversity only strengthens our landscape. December is a month where many students show a special spirit by giving *to others*. We also encourage students by saying: **"Take the time to get to know someone new, someone different than you"**.


