ECO TIPS and HEALTHY SCHOOLS

Computer/Monitor Month. When you are not working at your computer, please make sure you have turned it off to save power. At home, you can even go a step further and unplug your devices that are not in use to reduce your Phantom Load.

Reducing Your Phantom Load

When you turn off your television, it's not using any power, right? Wrong. In fact, some TVs - and many other plugged-in electric devices — use power even when they're turned off. About five to 10 per cent of a home's electricity consumption is used for this

"phantom load" according to Natural Resources Canada. To reduce this waste, plug multiple devices into a power bar, and use the bar's master switch to cut and restore power. This works particularly well for chargers for cell phones and electronic devices, which are common phantom load draws. For entertainment systems, use a "smart strip" that shuts off power to some devices while leaving others, such as a personal video recorder, powered on. And when you're looking to buy appliances and electronics. look for EnergyStar products, which use less electricity in



standby mode.
