During our Measurement unit, students were using non-standard units (e.g., cubes, straws, paperclips, toothpicks, etc.) to measure a variety of classroom objects. They were given a group challenge to try to create the tallest tower possible using only the materials that they were provided with. Students persevered and shared their creative ideas with one another on how to build a stable, yet

tall tower that they could then measure. The Grade Ones also made predictions and took daily measurements of five growing animal toys. These animal toys grew in length and width when submerged in water and the Grade Ones were eager to see them grow bigger each day!



Students need to come to school dressed to play outside during recesses (hats, scarves, gloves/ mittens, boots, etc.) It is advisable for children to bring extra pants and socks, in case they get wet. Please ensure that your children have indoor shoes at school that they can change into when they come inside. Being physically active during winter is an essential part of a healthy lifestyle. The school administration keeps a close eye on weather conditions including wind chill. When conditions necessitate, students will remain inside for recess. When conditions allow reduced outdoor recesses may take place. If a student is well enough to attend school, then he/ she will be expected to go outside for recess
