From the Library Learning Commons



Although Mother Nature tried her best to interfere with our BRAINPOW-ER@REGENCY STEAM Conference on February 27th, the day was a great success. We did have to consolidate a few of the sessions due to several of our presenters not being able to attend, but students were wonderful about the switches. To start our day, students in grades 4-8 listened to our guest speaker Dave Doucette, a STEAM Consultant for Fast Motion Studios in Toronto. In his message, he talked about how STEAM is an important, integrated part of the entertainment industry from the actual story line, to stunt action shots to filming and editing. He also talked about the soft skills (communication, creativity, initiative, positive growth mind set, etc.) that are needed in today's job markets. Students then participated in 3 one hour session activities throughout the rest of the day in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math (STEAM). Students enjoyed robotics, sewing, baking, knitting, chromatography, Cyber Crime and Data Retrieval, Finger Print Retrieval, TV/Movie Stunt Action Design, Creating Limbs and Joints, Woodworking, Careers in STEM computer activities, Brainy Games and much more.

Dressing for Cold/ Wet Weather



Students need to come to school dressed to play outside during recesses (hats, scarves, gloves/ mittens,

boots, etc.) It is advisable for children to bring extra pants and socks, in case they get wet. Please ensure that your children have indoor shoes at school that they can change into when they come inside. Being physically active during winter is an essential part of a healthy lifestyle. The school administration keeps a close eye on weather conditions including wind chill. When conditions necessitate, students will remain inside for recess. When conditions allow, reduced outdoor recesses may take place. If a student is well enough to attend school, then he/she will be expected to go outside for recess.

Summer Institute


