Student Dress Code



Attending school is an important activity. Look

upon it as your job. You will have to accept dress standards at work and in many other situations. Your manner of dress affects the tone of your school and reflects how you think about yourself. Students are expected to dress in a manner that contributes to the learning atmosphere.

Students are expected to come to school appropriately attired for classroom learning and should reflect their increasing physical maturity. Muscle shirts, beach wear, mini skirts and mini dresses. halter tops, clothing that exposes undergarments, spaghetti straps tops, half of cut off T-Shirts, short shorts, bare midriff tops are considered inappropriate in school. Shorts and skirts need to be mid-thigh or longer in length. For all grades, any clothing

with objectionable or

offensive words, signs, or logos on them are considered inappropriate as well. Students who are not appropriately dressed will be required to change offending clothing items or cover them with another piece of clothing. We have a number of clean clothing items that may be borrowed. Should a student refuse to comply with the above, parents will have to pick their child up so that he/she may go home to change.





Grade 3 and Grade 6 students will be taking part in the provincial Assessment of Reading, Writing and Mathematics created by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) soon. This assessment is administered to all Grade 3 and 6 students in Ontario's publicly funded school system. EQAO assessments are an important source of information about student strengths and areas needing improvement. We can use them as a school community, along with other information, to guide our school improvement planning goals for reading, writing and mathematics.

The results are also used by our school board and the Ministry of Education to direct attention and resources where they are needed. Grade 3 AND Grade 6 students will complete the assessment from May 25-27.

We are very excited at Regency to create our very own Butterfly Garden in front of our school thanks to a grant received from Learning for a Sustainable Future (LSF). Butterflies aren't just beautiful creatures - they're an important part of every eco-system because, second only to bees, they pollinate

Butterfly populations are suffering: land is being cleared and developed in North America at a staggering pace, and butterfly habitats are quickly dwindling. We would like to thank LSF, a Canadian non-profit dedicated to integrating sustainability education into Canada's education system. LSF's EcoLeague program provided funding to support this environmental/social action project.
