

BOKs

Mrs. Moffitt, Ms. Thomas and Ms. Watt's (Regency's Lead Trainers) are pleased to announce the launch of BOKs, a free before school physical activity program, at Regency. BOKs prepares children for a day of learning and is an important step in helping children gain an appreciation of the benefits of exercise and healthy choices that will last a lifetime. BOKs was inspired by Dr. John Ratey's book "SPARK" . Dr. Ratey, of

Harvard Medical School, states that "exercise is the single most powerful tool that we have to optimize the function of our brains." Classes are filled with team-oriented games and provide plenty of opportunity for play, since the program focus on fun? BOKs will run every Tuesday and Thursday morning, from 7:30 am to 8:00 am. Depending on the weather, we will be either in the large gym or outside. The program (free) is being offered to students in Grades 3 to 7 and has a limit of 25 participants. BOKs at Regency will begin on the morning of November 14th and is almost full. Parents will be notified of their child's acceptance in the program and due to the great interest in the program, a 2nd session will be made available in the new year. We hope that you will share our enthusiasm for this program and you will, in turn, see a positive impact on your children.
