Principal's Message

Dear Regency Families,

From **November 12-30**, 2018, all YRDSB students in Grades 7 to 12 and parents/guardians of students in Kindergarten to Grade 6 will be invited to participate in a system-wide census entitled, the **Every Student Counts Survey** (ESCS). The purpose of the survey is to better understand our students and their experiences in school and outside of school. The survey will evaluate YRDSB's <u>Equity Action Plan</u> and fulfill the <u>Minister of Education's Direction #10</u>. A letter was sent home to all parents. Please review this letter, especially Kinder-Gr. 6 parents who will complete the survey with their child(ren) at home.

We are excited to begin our 1st Annual **BigBox Fundraiser**. A letter will go home to all families soon outlining the details. Basically, each family will receive a sample box of 33 All Occasion cards for a price of \$33. If you like the cards, you can order a box (or more!). If you don't wish to order, simply return the sample box to school. Note: For every box we sell, the school receives \$11. Our goal is to sell 400 boxes so please help support this event. There will also be a draw for a 32GB ipad Touch plus store gift cards. Everyone needs cards at home!

As for morning drop-off procedures I would like to stress the importance of student safety. There are many cars in our Kiss N Ride that make U-Turns after morning drop-off and this is dangerous. Also, please **DO NOT DROP OFF your child(ren) to school before 8:10 am** as there are no staff members supervising. Supervision begins at 8:10 am.

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Festive Shop




BOKs

Mrs. Moffitt and Ms. Thomas (Regency's Lead BOKS Trainers) are pleased to announce the continuation of BOKs, a free before school physical activity program, at Regency. BOKs prepares children for a day of learning and is an important step in helping children gain an appreciation of the benefits of exercise and healthy choices that will last a lifetime. BOKs was inspired by Dr. John Ratey's book "SPARK" . Dr. Ratey, of Harvard Medical School, states that "exercise is the single most powerful tool that we have to optimize the function of our

brains." Classes are filled with team-oriented games and provide plenty of opportunity for play, since the program focus on fun? Thank you to all students, parents, and family members who supported our Scholastic Book Fair in October. We made a profit of about \$1800, which will be used to purchase new novels, non-fiction and picture books from Scholastic throughout the school year! Although this sounds like a lot, the average price of a hard covered book is over \$25, and those funds dwindle quickly! We will have another Scholastic Book Fair in February, as well as a Chapters night in January. More details will be sent out closer to both those events. We are very fortunate to have Canadian Children's Author Joel Sutherland coming to Regency on November 21st. He is a fabulous speaker, and I know our grade 3 - 8 students will thoroughly enjoy his visit. The cost per student is \$2, which students are to bring and give to their classroom teacher before November 19th. He will have his books for sale the day of his visit. Books will be \$7 to \$9 and he is willing to autograph them at morning recess on the 21st!

Finally, our Forest of Reading Club will begin in mid November. Students in grades 5-8 who are interested in joining will be expected to read a minimum of 6 of the nominated books between November and mid April. Legalization of Cannabis

As of October 17, 2018, it will be legal for individuals 19 and older to buy, use, possess and grow recreational cannabis. It remains illegal for anyone under the age of 19. This is the same as the minimum age for the sale of tobacco and alcohol in Ontario.

Regardless of age, cannabis is not allowed on school property or at school-related events at any time.

It is illegal for **anyone** regardless of age to smoke or vape any substance, including cannabis:

- at school, on school grounds, and all public areas within 20m of these grounds
- on children's playgrounds and public areas within 20m of playgrounds
- in child care centres, or where an early years program is provided
- in places where home child care is provided even if children aren't present
 There will be consequences for students if they are believed to be in possession or
 under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs or cannabis. Suspension will be considered.
 There are exceptions if the medicinal use of cannabis is outlined in the student's Health
 Care Plan.

If a student gives alcohol or cannabis to anyone under the age of 19, the school will contact police, suspend the student and consider expulsion.

In YRDSB, we want families and students to be informed about the facts of cannabis legalization. To support this learning, you may find the following resources helpful. You can also request a hard copy through the school office.


