

The month of October and the fall are always a time to reflect on change. Outside the leaves are changing colour and the weather is becoming significantly cooler. I hope you have enjoyed some lovely family hikes to admire the fall colours. This is a great time to remind children about the importance of dressing warmly. Younger children should have a change of clothes in their backpack, even for older children, a change of socks and an extra sweater are a great idea to keep in their backpack. Feet often get wet in the rain and snow and it is helpful to have these extra items.

Math has been a big topic of conversation around the province and Regency Acres has been no different. As parents, we need to seize opportunities to embed math into our conversations. Hallowe'en was a perfect example, I asked my chil-

dren while we were buying Hallowe'en candy, if I buy a box of 90 chocolate bars and I give 2 to everyone who comes to our door, how many kids will get candy? If you go to 20 houses and they give you 3 pieces of candy each, how many will you get? Similar guestions can be asked around other holidays or weekly trips to the grocery store. There are some great websites that offer math games and help. Your child's teacher can provide you with some good ones. I often like to spend some time with my children while they are playing the games to talk about math and what they can do to figure out the answers, i.e., Use the math page in their agenda, use a calculator, ruler, draw a picture, use numbers, etc. Finally, for those students who are in Grade 7 or 8, the ministry has a website where students can chat with a teacher who can help
