In total our students ran 5,373 km. Thank you for supporting this cause. Thank you to those families who were able to join us for our virtual Curriculum Night October 22nd. Our teachers enjoyed sharing their classrooms with you. Families will have the opportunity to meet virtually with teachers at our parent-teacher interviews on Thursday November 12th and Friday November 13th. As November begins we can feel the chill in the air and we anticipate the first snow. We also begin to mark some significant events in our history with rich conversations and acknowledgements regarding these impactful events.

The first week of November is officially Ontario's Treaties Recognition Week. During the week of November 2 - 6, 2020, we recognize the importance of treaties and bring awareness to the treaty relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people in the province. Treaties are legally binding agreements that set out the rights, responsibilities and relationships of First Nations and the federal and provincial governments. There are 46 treaties in Ontario and we all have a responsibility to honour the treaties. To help discuss this concept at home, you could research on which treaty territory Regency Acres or your home is situated? When was the treaty made and what promises are in it? You could further extend the conversation to talk about what a promise means to you.

At Regency Acres P.S., we begin our week in a good way, by sharing our land acknowledgement over the announcements every Monday morning. This helps us acknowledge the land that we are on, recognizing the treaty that was made, and to appreciate the relationships we develop.

The first week in November is also Holocaust Education Week. The Holocaust was a systemic persecution and murder of six million Jews by the Nazi regime and its allies, and it's important that we not allow this chapter of modern history to fade from memory. It is also important to acknowledge that people of colour, the Romas, people with physical disabilities, and those who identified as 2SLGBTQ were also targeted and murdered. As one means of working towards a world free of intolerance, racism and hatred, we encourage discussions, learning about events and outcomes of the Holocaust, in the age appropriate ways to honour the many people in age appropriate ways, about the Holocaust, and the many people who put their lives on the line in the face of antisemitism and varied forms of hate.

A reminder that November 13th is a PA Day.


Please remember to pack your child/ren snacks, lunch and water bottles daily. At Regency, we offer a limited snack selection to the students.

#### Student Cell Phone Use – Guideline

Cell phones and other personal communications devices are to be turned off and kept out of sight during all instructional periods, except with the explicit permission of the classroom teacher.

Cell phone camera functions are not permitted to be used on school property without explicit permission from the principal or designate.

Infractions will be dealt with as student discipline, under the Safe and Supportive Schools Policy and Procedure. Students need a clear understanding that inappropriate use of technology, including electronic devices such as cell phones, can result in consequences should the behaviour directly impact the learning environment. For example, posting negative comments regarding school staff or other students on *Social Media* to engage in conversations that affect the physical and/or social/emotional safety of staff and students may result in consequences.

This has been shared with parents and students earlier in September. We want students to understand the privilege it is to use technology in the classroom and that it is for instructional purposes only. Students must learn to demonstrate proper "Netiquette" when using technology. That conducting themselves appropriately and respectfully in person and online is important to their development and the relationships they build and maintain through their education.



# Allergies

Parents/guardians we encourage you to avoid the use of substitute peanut butter products.

• These products tend to look, taste, and smell very much like peanut butter. While the product is nut free, it mimics a known allergen that causes anaphylaxis in some children to the degree that it is indistinguishable from the allergen. It is a convincing sub-

stitute, opening up the possibility that it can be confused as peanut butter, or worse yet, peanut butter could be confused as this soybased product.

Please ensure that the snacks are NUT FREE, as we have several children with life threatening allergies.

### Kiss and Ride

We encourage families to walk to school as much as possible, as it gets the day started with some fresh air and exercise. However, we know that many of you come by vehicle. We ask that you please arrive between 8:10 am and 8:25 am. The parking lots are for staff access and parking only. When dropping off children please use the Kiss and Ride. Our students' safety is a priority and we will need to work together to ensure that we are following road laws and school procedures. When using the Kiss and Ride please follow these expectations:

- Avoid U-turns they are illegal and unsafe.
- A Kiss and Ride is continuous a line of cars, pull up as far as you can before unloading
- Do not let children exit the vehicle before you have pulled up
  - Have children exit on the school side (curb side) of the vehicle
  - Do not stop or park the car to get students out -we will supervise them as they enter the front doors
  - Wait for the cars ahead of you before driving off (please no u-turns at this point either)
