Our school was selected to participate in "Active Aurora"!

On Wed., May 13th, M.P. Lois Brown proclaimed to the House of Commons that the Town of Aurora will become "Canada's Most Active Community" over the next five years.

We are proud to announce that our school has been selected to participate in "ACTIVE AURORA" which is a community project that works with over 40 community leaders in Aurora who have come forward from a number of sectors to build a sustainable plan to address the challenge of sedentary-related lifestyle diseases that can be reversed through appropriate age-directed programs. We **are 1 in 4 or 5 school communities that have been selected** to receive the following supports:

- A PLAY DAY event involving grades 2-4 students in a multi-sport experience provided by the Town that orients them to fundamental movement skills (FMS) in a playful environment.
- A Quality Daily Physical Activity Mentorship Program where a mentor coach will be present to assist and mentor teachers in the delivery of physical activity during the school day. Mentors will monitor the development of students' physical activity during the school day and assess their physical literacy skills during a 12 week period.
- An enhanced **Active and Safe Routes to School program** through public health, school board, community and municipal engagement.
- A Physical Literacy Summit to provide leaders from the schools, early childhood education, municipal recreation, public health and other stakeholders with a one-day experience designate to elevate their awareness, interest, and delivery of physical literacy.

Mrs. Moffitt will be coordinating with the Active Aurora Program Committee.

YRDSB policy #680.0, STUDENT TRANSPORTATION indicates the following:

Non Transportation Zone This is an area designated by Board policy as ineligible for school vehicle transportation.

<u>Junior Kindergarten to Grade 3</u> – a child who lives within <u>1.2 km</u> of the school is **not** eligible for Boardprovided transportation.

<u>Grade 4 to Grade 8</u> – a child who lives within <u>1.6 km</u> of the school is **not** eligible for Board-provided transportation.

Note: Any student with known health problems that may require special consideration affecting transportation **need to supply a medical note/plan that would support the Request for Special Transportation** (see Policy #662.0, Provision of Health Support Services in School Settings) Please note that a Principal <u>must support</u> the board policy.

Parents, if you do not qualify for bussing, please DO NOT have your child take the bus in the morning or after school as this poses a safety risk for your child as their names will not be registered as "bus students" which means that in the event of an emergency there will be no notification.
