
Message from the Principal

Literacy Enhancements - Literacy resources for students (reading and Math)

Safety In and Around Regency

Scooters and Skateboards:

We ask that students lock up Scooters and Skateboards on the bike racks. We are asking that they not be stored in lockers as we have already had an injury with scooters being swung around and it may fall out of a locker.

Please have a lock so it can be left at the bike racks.





Kiss and Ride:

A reminder: please pull up to the end of the Kiss and Ride, do not stop in the middle to let off students. We do not want anyone to get into an accident and want to keep traffic moving smoothly through the drop off.

Please avoid "U TURNS" when using the KissNRide.

Concussions:

Our school board protocol around concussions is: If your child has sustained a concussion whether at school, at home or somewhere else, please ask us for a concussion form. This form helps give us direction around what your child can or cannot do and when they may resume activities.

Lunch Time

As a reminder to parents, please be aware that allowing your child to spend the lunch hour off school property may put your child at risk. Once off school property, your child's destination and activities may be unknown and unsupervised. The

school is NOT responsible for students who leave school property during the lunch break. If students stay at school for lunch, they must remain on school property for the remainder of the noon break. When deciding to give your child

permission to leave for lunch, please think carefully about your decision and speak to your child about the responsibilities of being off school property and what to do if they encounter dangerous or uncomfortable situations.

Vehicle Safety

A reminder to all parents, who drop off in the morning and pick up at the end of the day. Please drive slowly when in our parking lot. In the first month of school, we have

witnessed some cars driving extremely fast in the parking lot. Remember there are many children and adults who may be in this area that may be hit. Please exercise caution when driving. We ask that you do not park in the fire route. As always, we encourage you to use the kiss and ride to drop off your children in the morning.
