## Principal's Report

## **Labour Update**

ETFO has ratified their central bargaining agreement and is now involved in local bargaining. Parent interviews will take place on an 'as needed' basis with the teacher contacting parents with concerns. Grade 1-8 students will receive a progress report on December 11.

### **Arts Programming**

There is \$2000 allocated towards arts programming this school year. Lisa has found a local artist to act as an 'artist in residence'. She will spend one week in the school working with every class in the school. She has created a unique activity for every grade that ties in with various curriculum expectations. Diana suggested having kits available for students to purchase if they wanted to duplicate the project at home. Lisa explained that would be difficult to do as materials need to be ordered ahead of time and it is uncertain how many students would choose to purchase the kits. Instead Lisa will ask the artist to develop a material list for each project that will be sent home with the students.

# **Healthy School (Fitness)**

\$1000 has been allocated to this. Groove Fitness will be returning to provide a dance program again this year.

## **Donations/Charities**

Regency will be donating \$200 to the Lions Club of Aurora this year. The school will also look into donating left over items from the Festive Shop.

A Helping Hands display will be set up to encourage donations to the Aurora Food Pantry. Each student will trace their hand and write a message on it. The cut out hands will be put up in a giant chain.

#### **School Council Forum**

Regency has been chosen to present our fundraising plan at the next School Council Forum! Lisa, Joan, Lynn and Carol

	will attend. Joan congratulated Carol for creating a thorough and easy to read, easy to understand FP (fundraising plan) that was noticed for its attributes.
Financial Report	Carol reviewed the fundraising plan and the changes from the previous month. Any surplus funds will be redirected to Literacy Enhancements. Instrument repairs will now be covered through the school board budget rather than Regency's school budget. Carol pointed out a discrepancy in the QSP deposits, she will review with Jo Greig and Norma. The revised fundraising goal is \$38 300.
Staff Report	Heather Deckert explained that staff members will be pairing up with community members to organize different aspects of Activate Aurora. The first initiative will be Walk to School Wednesday. The formal kickoff will be December 9 with the Jingle Bell Walk where all students who walk will receive a jingle bell. There will be a school wide walk this day to ensure that all students get a chance to participate.
Fundraising Report	Festive Shop Donations will be accepted beginning November 30 and the Festive Shop is scheduled for December 8 and 9.
	Popcorn Shop Gwen updated on the popcorn shop and it has been very popular. Grade 7 and 8 students are running the shop but students from all grades will be selected to assist. Jill suggested an option to make a bulk payment, but Gwen explained that they are trying to run it like a shop where the students are learning skills such as making change and counting inventory.
	Bake Sale/Winter Concert The Winter Concert will take place December 16 and we are looking for donations of baked goods. Karyn Clegg will be the lead on the bake sale. The grade 8 students will be running the table. Request for baked goods will be in the next newsletter as well as an email request.
	New Initiatives The Fundraising Committee is looking at the possibility of a movie/popcorn night in January. This may be done as a free movie night with just the sale of popcorn. Looking ahead to other fundraising events, Pat suggested trying to tie in the dance-a-thon with the spring fundraiser, as they are both large events that take a lot of time and volunteers. Joan thanked Pat for her observations and said

	that Leah and Karyn are in the early stages of planning these fundraisers (timing, logistics, level of student involvement, etc.) and that they will take into consideration the workload and amount of volunteers needed as they continue to plan any events.
