


We extend good wishes to all students, families and staff who celebrate Ridvan a very happy celebration.

Small Steps Can Make Big Change This Earth Month

It's Earth Month and there are steps we can all take to help reduce our environmental footprint.

Use active travel. Taking the school bus and walking, riding or biking to school helps reduce pollution and traffic congestion in our neighbourhoods. It's also great for your mental health, well-being and academic performance.

- If you drive, consider parking near the school and walking the rest of the way (obeying all neighbourhood parking rules). Even this small change can make a difference.
- The walk to school is also a great time to connect, look for signs of spring and appreciate the changing season.

Reduce your energy and water use. Turn off lights, TVs, computers, when you do not need them. Turn off the tap when you're not using the water.

Reduce your waste. Using a refillable water bottle for example, helps to reduce the use of plastic water bottles. Bring your own bags to the store. Reuse whatever items you can. Repair items that are broken instead of throwing them away. Recycle wherever possible instead of contributing to the landfill.

Plant a tree, native plant or vegetable garden. Learn about native species and plants that attract birds, bees and butterflies.

Explore the outdoors! There is no better way to celebrate Earth Week than going for a walk. Check out <u>York Regional Forest</u> to discover nature in your backyard. Want to take your Earth Day celebrations out of the classroom? Why not visit one of Ontario's 290 conservation areas? <u>Here's a map</u> to help you locate the one nearest to you. Don't forget to check <u>Whose</u> <u>Land</u> to acknowledge whose territory you are on.

For inspiration on using nature as a classroom, Resources for Rethinking offers a <u>Step</u> <u>Outside guide</u> that highlights what's happening in nature seasonally

To amplify the effects, turn Earth Day into Earth Week or Earth Month and select a variety of activities to support collective learning and action for a week or month.

Student Expectations in the Community

We are lucky to have positive relationships with community vendors. Many students enjoy eating lunch at the Costco food court. Costco has asked if students could please:

School Safety

Please be reminded that all visitors to the school must sign in at the main office and get a visitor tag. This tag should be clearly visible while in the building on business. Students are reminded not to bring guests anywhere on school property (indoors and outdoors) as well as to the library during school hours.

Attendance



Students are expected to be in their scheduled classes each period. If you sign your child out of school, they need to leave school property. This includes the library during school hours, as it is considered to be school property during the school day. Please do

not give your child permission without calling and giving the office notice for them to be in the

library during the day. TeachAssist Parent Portal

Students in Secondary School use TeachAssist to view their schedules and ongoing assessment. They can also schedule guidance appointments. Through this portal, you will be able to view your child(ren)'s marks, and book interviews with teachers for the Interview evenings held each semester (more information on this semester's interview evening will come closer to the date).

Notice From Richmond Green Library

In recent years, we have faced recurring challenges in our library washrooms, including issues such as vaping, eating, and disruptive gathering during school hours. Despite the diligent efforts of both the library and RGSS, it's hard to maintain continuous monitoring due to limited staff availability.

After a thorough review of the situations, the library and RGSS will start to implement new measures to address these concerns. Effective November 9, 2023, the library will enforce restricted access to the washrooms during school hours.

1. Locking washrooms: Both library washrooms will remain locked during school hours.

2. Key sign-out procedure: Students may obtain a washroom key by leaving their student cards at the service desk. Student cards will be returned upon key return. Only one student is permitted at a time.

3. Limited occupancy: A maximum of two users will be allowed to enter the same washroom simultaneously.

4. Reporting disruptions: Any disruptive behaviours observed will be reported to both the library and RGSS administration for appropriate action.

We hope these measures will help create a more conducive and respectful environment within our library facilities, and promote a better learning atmosphere for all RGSS students.

Anaphylaxis HEALTH CARE PLAN	This form should be completed for all students with a life threatening allergy.
Asthma HEALTH CARE PLAN	This form should be completed for all students with asthma.
Epilepsy (Seizure Disorders) HEALTH CARE PLAN	This form should be complete for all students with a seizure disorder (including epilepsy).
Type 1 Diabetes HEALTH CARE PLAN	This form should be completed for all students with diabetes.
Health Care Plan (Other)	This from should be completed for all other serious and potentially life threatening health conditions that are not already specifically addressed (Asthma, anaphylactic, diabetes, and seizure health care plans).
