Message from Our Trustee

February 2024

As we start the second semester and second half of the school year, I want to take this opportunity to share some updates about upcoming dates, events and initiatives taking place across our system with you. I also want to thank everyone who contributes to building a strong educational community in York Region District School Board - the students, families, staff members and community partners who come together in support of student learning, achievement and well-being.

February is **Black History Month**. In addition to a number of <u>events taking place</u> within the school board and local community, the school board is once again Celebrating Black Excellence through its Black Voices campaign. <u>Black Voices</u> aims to centre and celebrate the Black members of our YRDSB community and share their voices. For families looking to learn more about school board and community events and programs for Black students and families, you can <u>subscribe</u> to the <u>Centre for Black Student Excellence mailing list</u> to receive regular updates.

Later this month, we will also recognize the <u>Lunar New Year</u> and wish all students, staff and community celebrating Lunar New Year a happy and joyful celebration.

While we have seen milder **winter weather** this year, I also want to remind families that we have protocols in place for <u>severe weather</u> and school transportation cancellation in the case of inclement weather, and want to ensure families are aware. You can find more information on the Board website. We also continue to encourage families to use active school travel all year round, including during the winter months. Early in February, we will be celebrating <u>Winter Walk Day</u>, and be sharing tips as well as the benefits and joys of winter walking.

This month, students in Grades 5-12 will have an opportunity to vote in the <u>Student Trustee</u> <u>Elections</u>. I want to congratulate and thank all of the students in Grade 10 and 11 who applied

for this position. Student Trustees play an important role representing student voice at the Board meetings and we greatly value their voice and contributions. Students who are eligible to vote will receive information in their GAPPS accounts about how to vote. This is a great opportunity to participate in the democratic process and to have their say about who will represent their voice in the next school year.

<u>Kindergarten</u> and <u>French Immersion</u> registration opened in January for fall 2024. For students looking at **course selection** in secondary school, there are lots of great resources available at www.yrdsb.ca/experience-yrdsb that let students learn more about courses, programs and opportunities that relate to their interests.

As the governing body of the York Region District School Board, trustees are required to establish an annual **Multi-Year Strategic Plan (MYSP)** to guide system direction for a four year period. The MYSP is a reflection of emergent priorities identified by our educational communities. Over the coming months, we will be conducting extensive consultations with YRDSB students, staff, families and community members to collect input and feedback to develop our revised MYSP. We look forward to hearing from you.

Guidance

Night School Registration

For students who have registered for night school on My Blueprint: You must print a "sign off" form and have it signed by a parent or guardian to approve your night school registration. Please then submit it to Guidance. Guidance will NOT approve your registration until we receive this sign off form. You will risk losing your spot in the class, if you do not submit this form.

For students still interested in registering for night school:

Registration will close at noon on Thursday, February 1, 2024. It will re-open on Friday, February 2, 2024 and students can register in limited courses that show availability up until the second night of classes which is Tuesday, February 20, 2024.

Traditional in class face-to-face <u>Night School program</u> (Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30 pm to 9:45 pm) will continue to use a *remote* learning delivery model. The program will be delivered virtually in real-time (synchronous).

First class Thursday, February 15, 2024 and the program ends Thursday, June 6, 2024. Students who register prior to Thursday February 8, 2024 will receive a Welcome email. Students with unapproved course requests will not be registered.

Should a course be cancelled, YRDSB students will receive an email through their gapps account.

<u>Virtual Consultations for Parents/Caregivers of the Tamil Diaspora Community</u>

Consultations will provide an opportunity for Tamil parents/caregivers to:

- Acquire strategies for cultivating meaningful interactions and connections with their child
- Explore ways to support their child's mental health and well-being
- Understand how to request and navigate accessing support, including mental health services, for their child at school
- Discuss current difficulties and challenges experienced by their child
- Learn about resources in the York Region community to better support their child's needs

School Washrooms

Students are reminded that school washrooms are not to be used for social activities including eating. At the beginning of the year, we introduced school "zones". The Green zones are areas

where students may sit, collaborate, socialize and eat. Yellow zones are for collaborating and socializing. Red zones are spaces such as stairwells (walking through only) and washrooms (bio breaks only). The zones are for everyone's safety in the school.

Parent/Caregiver Series Supporting Learning about Mental Health

The objective of the series is to promote and enhance mental health literacy. The first session is "Anxiety in School-Aged Youth, a Presentation for Parents and Caregivers" and will occur virtually on February 28 from 6 - 7 p.m. The presentation will focus on the characteristics of anxiety, and some general strategies that may be beneficial in supporting your children and their anxiety.

School Safety

Please be reminded that all visitors to the school must sign in at the main office and get a visitor tag. This tag should be clearly visible while in the building on business. Students are reminded not to bring guests anywhere on school property (indoors and outdoors) as well as to the library during school hours.

Attendance



Students are expected to be in their scheduled classes each period. If you sign your child out of school, they need to leave school property. This includes the library during school hours, as it is

considered to be school property during the school day. Please do not give your child permission without calling and giving the office notice for them to be in the library during the day. TeachAssist Parent Portal

Students in Secondary School use TeachAssist to view their schedules and ongoing assessment. They can also schedule guidance appointments. Parent/guardians may also register for the TeachAssist Parent Portal. Through this portal, you will be able to view your child(ren)'s marks, and book interviews with teachers for the Interview evenings held each semester (more information on this semester's interview evening will come closer to the date).

Notice From Richmond Green Library

In recent years, we have faced recurring challenges in our library washrooms, including issues such as vaping, eating, and disruptive gathering during school hours. Despite the diligent efforts of both the library and RGSS, it's hard to maintain continuous monitoring due to limited staff availability.

After a thorough review of the situations, the library and RGSS will start to implement new measures to address these concerns. Effective November 9, 2023, the library will enforce restricted access to the washrooms during school hours.

- 1. Locking washrooms: Both library washrooms will remain locked during school hours.
- 2. Key sign-out procedure: Students may obtain a washroom key by leaving their student cards at the service desk. Student cards will be returned upon key return. Only one student is permitted at a time.
- 3. Limited occupancy: A maximum of two users will be allowed to enter the same washroom simultaneously.
- 4. Reporting disruptions: Any disruptive behaviours observed will be reported to both the library and RGSS administration for appropriate action.

We hope these measures will help create a more conducive and respectful environment within our library facilities, and promote a better learning atmosphere for all RGSS students.

Medical Information

A reminder if your child has a serious medical condition and has not received the medical forms, please fill out the appropriate form(s) below and return to the Main Office. Please complete new forms each school year.

Anaphylaxis HEALTH CARE PLAN	This form should be completed for all students with a life threatening allergy.
Asthma HEALTH CARE PLAN	This form should be completed for all students with asthma.
Epilepsy (Seizure Disorders) HEALTH CARE PLAN	This form should be complete for all students with a seizure disorder (including epilepsy).
Type 1 Diabetes HEALTH CARE PLAN	This form should be completed for all students with diabetes.
Health Care Plan (Other)	This from should be completed for all other serious and potentially life threatening health conditions that are not already specifically addressed (Asthma, anaphylactic, diabetes, and seizure health care plans).

COVID Health and Safety Protocols for 2023-2024

York Region Public Health has advised that schools continue to be required to follow the Ministry's COVID-19: health and safety measures at schools.

All students, staff and visitors need to complete the self-screening tool. Students should complete the <u>COVID-19 self screening tool</u> and follow instructions and next steps. Masks are optional for students, staff and visitors.

Surfaces in the school building will continue to be disinfected and hand sanitizer is available. Appropriate hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette will continue to be promoted throughout the day.
