- Universities/Colleges have full access to all your Gr 11 and Gr 12 marks
- All attempts at courses will be noted on the transcript
- Courses taken and withdrawn after the full disclosure date will be flagged with a “**W**”
- Semester 1 course changes made after November 28 will be reported on your transcript.
- Semester 2 course changes made after May 6 will be reported on your transcript.

Grade 12 students must be enrolled in a minimum of 3 credits each semester. Part-time status is not permitted, unless extenuating circumstances.

Credits from outside of RGSS



If taking a credit outside of RGSS you must:

- Provide documentation to Guidance confirming enrolment.
- Students **cannot** be enrolled in the same course at day school and private school
- If you are enrolled in a pre-requisite credit now for a Sem 2 course, the final report card must be submitted by **Friday, January 24, 2020**.
- All final marks must be forwarded to us by **Wednesday, June 17, 2020**.





- Some programs may require interviews, auditions or portfolio.

What courses do I need?

- Research program requirements
- A minimum of **6 Grade 12 “U” or Grade 12 “M”** courses are required for application

What Grades do I need?

- Schools will publish last years cut off marks for entry into their programs.

How to apply?



College:

- go to www.ontariocolleges.ca
- costs \$95.00 for 5 choices - maximum 3 at one college.
- Open to apply now
- Apply before **Feb. 1, 2020**

University:

- go to www.ouac.ca
- 2018/2019 costs \$150.00 for 3 choices, \$50.00 for each extra choice. (**2019-2020 fees available early October**)
- Need PIN to apply, available mid November
- Apply before **Jan. 15, 2020**

After I apply...



You may receive communications through

- mail
- email
- School portal

Not all schools communicate the same way.

You may also need to complete;

- an English Language test and/or English Language proficiency test.
- a portfolio.
- a supplemental application / statement of experience.
- an interview.

When do I find out?



College:

- **February 1, 2020** earliest date an offer could be made
- Respond by **May 1, 2020**

University:

- Early offers typically in March or end of April
- Latest date – **May 27, 2020**
- Conditional offers (must maintain average)



Out of Province

- After you have applied to Ontario Universities through OUAC, start the application process for out-of-province universities
- Complete individual applications for each university. Pay close attention to:
 - Application Fees
 - Application deadlines
 - Programs of study
 - Admission requirements
 - Scholarship information
- Verify which of these universities can obtain your high school marks through OUAC (they will ask for your reference # on your application)



U.S. Colleges



- Make an appointment with your alpha counsellor to discuss information and logistics of applying to U.S. colleges
- Register and write SATs (if you haven't done so already)
- Students interested in applying for early decision must see your alpha counsellor ASAP

Common Questions...

When do marks get submitted to the Colleges / Universities?

What if I retake a course?

Do I need to send my marks?



Do all schools/programs give alternate offers?

Do Colleges and Universities see Gr 11 marks?

Additional Questions:



I might take a year off after secondary school (a gap year). Can I defer my acceptance to the following year?

→ Policies about deferrals vary. Contact the school directly to find out their policy

Additional Questions:



Will I be considered for Early Admissions?

- Universities will review Gr 11 marks and sometimes decide to offer an early admission. Otherwise, schools will wait to see your Gr 12 marks.



Additional Questions:



What if I have an "IEP" and I am applying to University or College?

- Same admission requirements as everyone else!
- After you have been accepted, YOU will have to contact the school's "Student Support Services Dept." to arrange supports and accommodations
- Make sure your psychological assessment has been updated within 3-5 years






ELL/ESL and Newcomers to Canada

- If you have been attending school in **Canada or in an English speaking country for less than 4 full years**, you will likely have to complete an English proficiency test. Eg. TOEFL or IELTS
- Check with the individual schools and testing bodies for requirements and deadlines

Equivalencies have not been granted this year yet. This will happen in November


