Full Disclosure




- The Ontario Student Transcript provides a record of a student's overall achievement in high school to post-secondary institutions
- In grades 9 and 10, only successfully completed courses appear on the transcript
- In grades 11 and 12, a list of ALL courses taken or attempted, with percentage grade, will appear on the transcript



Full Time Student Status

- Students are required to carry a full-time course load
- Grade 9-11 students must carry eight courses
- Grade 12 students must carry a minimum of six courses (three in each semester)
- Night School and E-learning Night School courses are available ONLY if the course cannot be provided during the day

- Be aware of admission requirements for possible destinations
- Review labour market trends



Graduation Requirements




- 30 credits




Prerequisite Planning

- Check individual colleges, universities and other post-secondary institutions' prerequisites






Math Pathways





- Must complete an online application form (https://goo.gl/IyQMui) and teacher reference forms
- In the spring you will receive an appointment to meet with Co-op to discuss your interests

Select 1 or 2 credit Dual Credit course in Career Cruising

Once a week in the afternoon


– can partner with Co-op or take morning classes only



Apprenticeships



- Hands-on training program 85-90% occurs 'on-the-job', while 10-15% takes place in the classroom
- Apprentices earn while they learn
- Requires competencies in Math, English and Science
- Grade 12 Math (MAP4C1 or MCT4C1)








Graduation Tracker




Adding Compulsory Courses

Click on the "+" to open the course options.






Adding Courses

Repeat for each of the compulsory courses.






Adding Courses

Repeat for each of the compulsory courses.






Adding Elective Courses

Click on the "+" to open the course options.






Adding Elective Courses

Course Description


Select the course you want.

If you don't click, on the x in the upper right corner.






Alternate Courses:

Choose these in the same way you choose the Elective courses






Issue Note - Red Sign

Warning Note - Blue Sign


Examples:

Other Credits

If you intend to take a course in summer school


Place that course in the "Other Credit" box

This allows you to select an additional course or one that you may not have the prerequisite for.

A blue exclamation mark will appear indicating that the course selected is going to be taken as an extra credit.

Only use this box if very certain you are taking a summer school course.





Final Step


Click the "SUBMIT" button to submit the courses






Summer School

When Summer School Registration is open click on the add course box under ConEd.





*NOTE: Music and Repertoire

No longer required to take Repertoire (before and after school band) with Music courses

If you choose to either take only repertoire or both repertoire and music together, you must choose Repertoire FIRST before all other electives

- Q: What compulsory courses do I have left to take in Grade 11?
- A:
 - -Grade 11 Math
 - -Grade 11 English
 - -Group 1, 2 and 3 compulsory credits must also be completed (if they haven't already)



Frequently Asked Questions...



- Q: Can Grade 11 students take a spare?
- A: NO. Grade 11 students must maintain a full time status (4 courses per semester)



Frequently Asked Questions...



- Q: How can I earn credits outside of RGSS?
- **A**: Some options might include:
 - -Night school (in person)
 - -Night school e-learning
 - -Day school e-learning
 - -Summer school
