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Eligibility Criteria:

- Students must be at least 16 years old, in grade 12 and **eligible to graduate** in June after OYAP
- Students returning for a 5th year **may** be considered depending on availability of seats
- Full day Co-Op required for semester 2, 40 community service hours strongly recommended completed and successful completion of literacy test or equivalent course.

What are some benefits of Accelerated OYAP?

1. Students become a signed apprentice while in High School and are supported by a Coop Teacher and an MTCU Training Consultant, and will become members of the Ontario College of Trades.
2. Students could earn up to 4 Cooperative education credits and a maximum of 3 Dual Credits towards their OSSD.
3. Students have the opportunity to earn all or part of their Level 1 (Basic) training at little to no cost to the student (for tuition).
4. Students will begin earning hours/competencies towards their apprenticeship while still in high school.
5. There are financial incentives for apprentices who complete various stages within an apprenticeship program for a designated Red Seal trade.
