



Compulsory Credits (con't)

Group Credits - you must take one credit from each group:

- **Group 1**: English (including the OSSLC), French as a second language, classical languages, international languages, Native languages, Canadian and world studies, Native studies, social sciences and humanities, guidance and career education, cooperative education.
- **Group 2**: French as a second language, the arts, business studies, health and physical education, cooperative education
- Group 3: French as a second language, science(grade 11 or 12), computer studies, technological education, cooperative education

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

*Typically written in Grade 10 *Students can rewrite if they aren't successful *There is a Grade 12 course (OLC4O1) that can be taken to earn this requirement

FOR THIS YEAR ONLY:

*<u>Grade 12 students graduating</u> this year - the OSSLT requirement is waived as a graduation requirement. *<u>Grade 11 and non-graduating Grade 12's</u> wrote the test in October

*Grade 10's will be writing in March

Community Involvement Hours

*40 hours are required to graduate

*Hours must be pre-approved so students know if they are eligible

*Eligibility is found on the board website and on the back of the paper form

*Hours are recorded on a form available in Guidance or on the Guidance Google classroom

*Hours can be submitted in person to Guidance or electronically through rhhs.guidance@yrdsb.ca

FOR THIS YEAR ONLY:

*Graduating Gr 12 students will complete 20 hours

*Up to 10 hours of part-time employment may be counted towards volunteer hours; these hours can not be counted after June 2022

*Up to 20 hours of volunteer work with family or neighbours may count; students have been informed about this change on the Guidance Google classroom; these hours can not be counted after June 2022

Post-Secondary Prerequisite Planning

Begin with the end in mind...

Check prerequisites for future program on My Blueprint, <u>www.ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca</u>, ontariocolleges.ca, and with your guidance counsellor

Add those courses to the Grade 12 column in My Blueprint; check the information My Blueprint gives...do you need a Grade 11 prerequisite course to take the Grade 12 course?

Add required courses to the Grade 11 column in My Bluenrint and so on for Grad

Add required courses to the Grade 11 column in My Blueprint and so on for Grade 10

NOTE - planning for future grades will not be submitted; this is planning only and can be changed at any time!






My Pathway Planner

Once you log-in (reminder – use your GAPPS username and password), "click on "High School". Then go to **"Official High** School Plan".



Once students submit their courses they are prompted with a **Send Approval Email** option. Once clicked, a parent or guardian's email address can be added.

Note: if they forget to send the approval email at the time of submission, they can simply open their High School Plan and click the option to **Send Approval Email** at a later time.

- After entering an email address and clicking Send Approval Email, the parent/guardian receives a course selection approval request email, including:
- In the course selection approval request email, the parent/guardian has the option to Approve or Reject the student's selections by clicking a button or link in the email.

Note on Alternate Courses: Students will be asked to select TWO alternate courses.

- These should be selected with the same intention and importance as other courses.
- Alternates courses WILL be used if the student has a conflict, without consultation, so ensure these courses are selected carefully.

<u>Drama Department</u> - **ADA301** - Production Drama **ADD4M1** - Production Drama

English Department -NBE3C/E/U1/E - Understanding Contemporary First Nations, Metis and Inuit Voices. This course will be offered at the college (NBE3C1), workplace (NBE3E1), university (NBE3U1) and AP level (NBE3UE).

<u>Technological Studies Department</u> -**TCJ201** - Construction Technology

A note about Gr. 11 English...

By September 2023 all Grade 11 English courses at all secondary schools in YRDSB will be replaced by the NBE course.

Additional Credit Opportunities

High Performance Athlete (HPA) Program – if you are competing at the provincial, national or international level you are eligible to take an HPA credit as one of your electives.

International Languages – these classes are taken once a week throughout the school year. Students can study a heritage language or learn something entirely new to them. Students select this course through My Blueprint in September.

<u>Repertoire</u> – this music class is taken outside of class time throughout the school year. Students typically practice 1– 2 times a week.

Course Change Policy

We have **not** enforced the Course Change Policy this year but **will** be doing so next year.

RHHS Course Change Policy

Requests to change student timetables past the course selection and verification date will be considered for the following criteria:

- ★ Missing prerequisite
 ★ Level change (ex. Wath the second second
- ★ Level change (ex. Want to change from academic to applied)
- ★ Pathway change (ex. Changing pathway from science to art)
- ★ Already have the credit (ex. Credit earned in summer school and it's still on timetable)
- ★ Incomplete timetable (ex. Gr 9-11 must have 4 courses each semester, Gr 12 have 3-4)

Please note: The above reasons for requesting a course change will not guarantee the change is made. Guidance will consider the request based on those reasons only. It is not always possible to make a change, based on what the timetable (ex. is the course even running? is it already full? does it conflict with other scheduled courses?)

Remember...student choices determine the timetable!

- if not enough students select a course, that course doesn't run
- the number of sections that each course has depend on how many students select that course
- once a course is full, additional students are not able to go into the course
- course sections are not added in September the staffing and timetabling process happen from February - May
