

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Secondary Online Learning Graduation Requirement

About the Online Learning graduation requirement;

Students are now required to earn two Online Learning credits to earn their OSSD, beginning with every student who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year. The graduation requirement is intended to support students in developing familiarity and comfort with working and learning in a fully online environment, as well as developing digital literacy and other important transferable skills that will help prepare them for success after graduation and in all aspects of their lives.

Meeting the Online Learning graduation requirement should not pose a barrier to graduation for students. As with all learning, students taking online courses will have access to the support they need through their school, (e.g., Individual Education Plans, guidance, and services for English-language learners).

Parents/guardians may choose to opt their child out of the mandatory online courses required for graduation. Students aged 18 years of age or older or students who are 16 or 17 years of age and have withdrawn from parental control can also opt out of the graduation requirement. Students and parents/guardians may opt back in to the Online Learning graduation requirement should their decision change.

Students can opt-out of the Online Learning Graduation Requirement when completing their course selections for next year. Parents will receive an email confirmation of the opt-out along with the submitted courses. You may also opt-out or opt-in by contacting your home school.

There are no academic penalties for opting out of this graduation requirement. The opt-out will be recorded on the transcript as "Online Learning Graduation Requirement - Non-Applicable".

If you do not wish to opt out, no action is required.

Students working towards other certificates (for example, the certificate of accomplishment or an Ontario Secondary School certificate) are not required to complete the Online Learning graduation requirement, yet may be encouraged to enroll in Online Learning courses to support the development of digital literacy and other important transferable skills that help prepare them for success after graduation and in all aspects of their lives.

Absence Policy

- VALID ABSENCES include illness, bereavement or family emergency.
- **AUTHORIZED ABSENCES** include dentist/doctor appointments, driver's test, and court appearances.
- EXCUSED ABSENCES refer to field trips and school sanctioned events. Students are still
 considered to be at school.
- EXTENDED ABSENCES of three days or more require the completion of a "Special Leave" form at least one week in advance of the leave. This form may be obtained from the Main Office. A parent/guardian signature is required. It is the student's responsibility to catch up on all work missed. DO NOT plan absences or family vacations during culminating and exam periods as the evaluations CANNOT be rescheduled.

For safety reasons, students who have signed out must leave the building as they will not be directly supervised

You are encouraged to discuss incidents of bullying by other students with your family and a trusted member of staff at the school. Any incidents involving staff members should immediately be communicated to the Principal or Superintendent of the school and are not to be reported online; any staff reports submitted online will be deleted.
