School Council Roles & Responsibilities

According to Ministry of Education Regulation 612/00 and Board Policy 262.0, the purpose of school councils is to support improved student learning and an increased sense of shared accountability for public education.

As stated in Board Policy 262.0:

"The Board believes that school councils play an important role in building school, family and community partnerships by providing input into relevant Board and school-level decisions and by encouraging the involvement of all members of the school community in support of student learning."

School councils are advisory bodies that can make recommendations to the principal or the Board on matters as stated in Board Policy and procedure. Specifically, school councils are responsible for:

- supporting and promoting parent, family and community engagement in support of student learning
- participating in the development and implementation of the school improvement plan;
- communicating with, and providing ongoing advice to, the principal matters pertaining to the school
- collaborating with the principal to coordinate community resources that support student learning needs

- Encourage the participation of all parents and of other people within the school community;
- Participate in committees and assist with tasks of the committee(s) and of Council as required;
- Support all Council initiatives

All parents are invited to attend Council meetings as guests of Council and speak to issues, but voting will be restricted to active Council members

Responsibilities of the Chair / Co-Chairs

- Call school council meetings, prepare the agenda and chair the meetings;
- Communicate with the school principal, senior Board staff and trustees, as required;
- Ensure that minutes are recorded, parents are consulted, fundraising meets Board policies, and the bylaws are reviewed annually;
- Requirements: Strong oral and written communication skills, organizational skills

Responsibilities of the Treasurer

- Provide Council with updates on balance of available funds
- Requirements: Strong oral and written communication skills

Responsibilities of the Secretary

- Take minutes at each meeting
- Review and edit minutes and forward to one of the chairs
- Requirements: Strong oral and written communication skills

A Day in the Life of a Principal & Vice Principal

While every day is different, our typical day consists of: Ensuring students are adequately supervised Talking with students (formally and informally) Meeting with the staff (teaching and support) Communicating with parents (proactively or follow-ups) Focusing on student achievement, engagement, and safety Responding to Ministry and Board directives and issues Collaborating with other colleagues on school and Board issues Managing facility issues with the lead caretaker Monitoring the safety of the building



Administrator Responsibilities

We have many duties and responsibilities under provincial law and school board policies:

providing a safe and welcoming learning environment ensuring the curriculum is being delivered and assessed appropriately

maintaining relationships with various stakeholders

ensuring resources are effectively delegated among students and programs – our budget is over \$250 000

implementing the professional learning for staff



Administrator Role

Principals and Vice Principals are instructional leaders - that means we assist teachers with planning, implementing and assessing the curriculum (what your child is learning)

There are also many managerial and operational aspects of our job that contribute to student achievement such as discipline, attendance, parent communication and scheduling

As the school's lead learners, we work with staff to build and sustain a positive learning environment

If You Have a Question

- If you have a question related to your child (well-being, curriculum, achievement, behaviour, classroom issues) your first contact should be with the teacher
- If your concerns are unresolved, you can then contact the Vice Principals or myself
- If you have a school-based question (bus, school grounds, parking lot, class placement) you should contact the Vice Principals or myself
 - It is best to contact us by phone, email or a meeting request

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Many Hats

While not a doctor or nurse, a police officer, a social worker, a day care supervisor or a mental health professional, as the lead learners we help students in many ways

Our staff may deal with many of the people noted above, and more if a student needs assistance beyond our expertise or what the school can directly provide

We have training in Emergency Response, Health and Safety, WHMIS, Threat and Risk Assessment, Suicide Intervention

We are experts in assessment and evaluation, curriculum development, instruction and differentiation

Every day, there are a number of decisions that have to be made, and our response is based on what is best for the entire school

Our goal everyday is to teach life lessons and the value of hard and determined work

Community Hours

 - Activities that take place during the time allotted for the instructional program on a school day (e.g., walking a younger neighbour or sibling to and from school, helping younger siblings with their homework)
 - Activities that include up to 10 hours of paid work, with the requirement to complete a reflection exercise indicating how their work contributed to service for others (e.g., grocery work during the pandemic)
 - Activities that consist of duties normally performed in the home (e.g., students could help an elderly relative with errands, provide after-school care for a sibling)
- Community involvement graduation requirement of 40 hours will be restored in 2022-2023
