



TD Scholarships for Community Leadership

The TD Canada Trust Scholarship for Community Leadership rewards students who have demonstrated consistent and outstanding dedication to solving a community problem or making their community a better place. For example, you may be cleaning up the environment, promoting social justice, or fighting child poverty. Successful candidates have shown exceptional initiative in making a meaningful and lasting difference in their community.

- **\$70,000 each including the following:**
- **Up to \$10,000 for tuition per year** (maximum of 4 years) **of full tuition at any approved University or College in Canada**
- **\$7,500 a year toward living expenses**
- **Offers of summer employment**

Eligibility Criterion:

- In the final year of high school, or CEGEP (in Quebec)
- **Outstanding Community Leadership**
- **Have demonstrated leadership in improving their community**
- **Obtain a minimum overall average in their most recently completed full year of school of 75%**

(The personal circumstances and/or challenges of each applicant will be considered)

Requirements:

- A fully completed and signed application
- **Three** copies of an essay of up to 600 words by you describing the community leadership involvement that is the basis of the application:
 - *Why you got involved, whether and how your involvement shows **initiative and innovation**, the way your efforts have strengthened others, how long you have been involved, what you think the long-term impact will be, how your community has affected you – in addition include a brief description of the range of your other community activities*
- **Two** letters of support or confirmation from the community group, groups, or individuals who have been the focus of the student's involvement
- **One** letter of recommendation from your school
- **NOTE: Electronic signatures will not be accepted for these letters**
- An official transcript of your academic record

You may also include one or both of the following (but it is not required):

- Three copies of an essay of up to 250 words describing your personal circumstances (family employment, economic situation, etc.) or other extenuating circumstances that may be relevant to your application
- One essay of up to 250 words detailing your activities if you have taken a year or more away from high school or CEGEP
