#### June is Pride Month

On Wednesday, June 5th, we will be raising the Pride Flag at Richmond Rose P.S.

#### History of Pride Flag

The Pride Flag is internationally recognized as a symbol of pride, hope and diversity. In 1978, Gilbert Baker, a San Francisco artist, designed the Pride Flag as a response to the need for a symbol to support the LGBT rights movement. The current flag has six stripes, each with its own meaning:



# Key Messages when discussing flying the Pride flag, the following talking points can set a positive tone for any conversation:

- In the York Region District School Board, we believe that Equity and Inclusive Education is the foundation for excellence.
- We believe all students must be treated with respect and dignity and have access to schools where they are safe, welcome, accepted and included.
- We want to develop resilient students who are engaged in their learning, who feel a sense of belonging in their school communities, and who feel supported to reach their highest potential.

- We are committed to ensuring equitable and inclusive learning and working environments that uphold and reflect the Seven Guiding Principles of Ontario's Equity and Inclusive Education Strategy.
- We recognize the diversity within our 2SLGBTQ+ communities and acknowledge the presence of indigenous, racialized, disabled and other diverse identities.
- Unfortunately, we see examples of bullying, hate propaganda, cyberbullying, homophobia, transphobia, racism and other expressions of discrimination in our society which can sometimes spill over into our schools.
- As indicated in the Indigenous Education and Equity Strategy, one of our system actions is to "interrogate and remove systemic barriers to well-being and achievement for underserved students through an anti-oppression lens."

## Flying the Pride Flag

- Demonstrates our commitment to eliminating harmful biases and prejudice that lead to discrimination and exclusion.
- Signals our commitment to upholding the principles outlined in the Ontario Human Rights Code and the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms which reflect the values held by Canadians and Ontarians.
- Aligns with the Director's Annual Plan which identifies Equity and Inclusivity as a priority area.

# **Cell Phone Policy**

A real focus for us as at Richmond Rose P.S. is to ensure a safe climate for learning so that students are fully prepared for lessons and any distractions are eliminated. To support this, we have made the decision to ban the use of mobile phones within the school because of the negative effect on student learning and well-being. If students decide to bring phones to school, they are to be kept in their locker for the ENTIRE day. At no time will mobile phones be permitted to be used during school hours.

The progressive approach of consequences will be implemented at Richmond Rose P.S. as follows:

A warning will be given to the student and they will also be asked to place the cell phone in their locker for the remainder of the day.

- 1. A warning will be given to the student and they will also be asked to place the cell phone in their locker for the remainder of the day. Further, a call will be made home to inform the parents/guardians.
- 2. The student will be asked to take their phone to the office. The phone will be placed, by the student, in a designated safe place. The student can then pick up their phone at the end of the day.

3. The student will be asked to take their phone to the office. The phone will be placed, by the student, in a designated safe place. At this point a phone call will be made home with the requirement for a parent / guardian to collect the phone on their child's behalf.

The restriction is in place at all times while students are on school grounds. This includes school entry, recess and lunch. Phones should not be accessed by students until they have left school. All student-parent communication should be directed through the school office.

Infractions will be dealt with as student discipline, under the Safe and Supportive Schools Policy and Procedures. Failure to comply with any of the aforementioned rules may result in student suspension.

#### **Parking Lot Safety**

PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THE STAFF PARKING LOT AND DO NOT BLOCK STAFF CARS AT ANY POINT IN THE DAY. PLEASE RESPECT THE SAFETY OF ALL OF OUR STUDENTS, PARENTS AND STAFF.

The safety of our students is our top priority and we need your cooperation to ensure that we are able to keep your children safe. **Parents are to use the kiss-and-ride to drop off children and not park in staff parking spots** and have children run across the parking lot.

In addition, for those that choose to park on the street and have your children j-walk across the road, we recommend that you walk over to the crosswalk and cross with the crossing guard. This will ensure a safe crossing for all of our students. A reminder that u-turns are not permitted on Frank Endean Drive as this creates an even greater risk of an accident.
