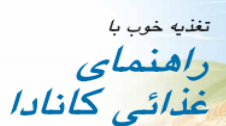


Healthy Schools

Literacy News

The instructional strategy this month is analyzing. Analyzing involves making sense of the text in relation to what one already knows. We use analytical skills to make inferences, interpret data, organize ideas, and make connections. Critical analysis of information gathered requires application of critical reading skills.

"Analyzing Information"

When is your child using this strategy?

Your child is using this strategy when they are reading for information. They sort and classify; sift information; presenting a coherent argument; drawing conclusions; and summarizing. Students may find that they have not gathered sufficient information through this analysis. Adapting information seeking strategies is to be encouraged as students begin to find new meaning from their reading.

Parents

What can you do?

When reading to your child, share with them your thoughts and the process.

- ⇒ Break a text into its component parts in order to understand its meaning and relate it to other texts.

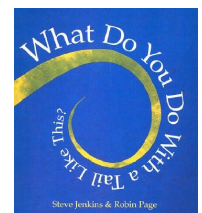
- ⇒ Use "thinking aloud" strategies to model analytic processes. Consider the following: What happens in your mind as you read for information? What questions are you asking? What thoughts are you entertaining? When do you reread? When do you pause and think? From what previous knowledge are you drawing as you make conclusions? What words must you stop and define in order to understand crucial information? Share this information with your students as you read a passage aloud.

Attach sticky notes as you come up with questions and/or ideas

- ⇒ Visit the public library and read books to your child

Student Busing Eligibility



Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy#680:

All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

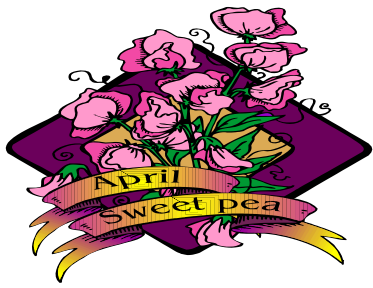
Comic Life

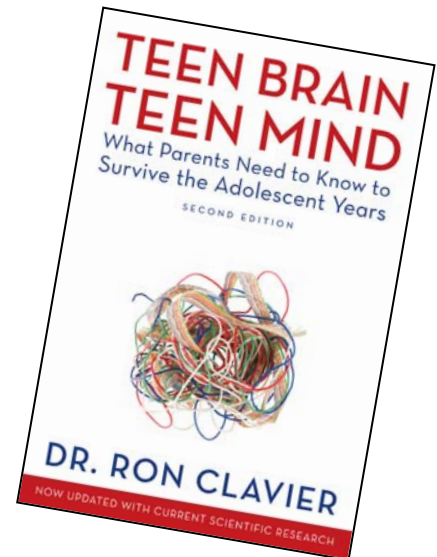
