## Message from the Principal

Dear Parents/Guardians,

It is at this time of year when I feel that the school year is moving along so quickly. We have accomplished much together as a staff and school community and will continue to persevere and provide optimal learning experiences for our students to achieve success.

During the past few years, our School council has funded our Arts performances. This year, we have enhanced the Arts initiative for our students by including hands-on experiences in addition to the variety of whole school presentations. Our younger students had the opportunity to participate in drumming activities. Our older students will learn about silk art and how to create beautiful artwork using this medium. Both these sessions are offered by parents of students in our school. This is a powerful example of meaningful and creative engagement by parents within our school community. Soon to come will be opportunities for our students to work with ceramics with our lovely SERT/Prep Teacher (also a resident Artist who was trained at OCADU), Suzanne Greenberg. Sadly, Suzanne will be completing her Long Term Occasional Position at our school a little after March Break. The weather continues to surprise us each day. It is not until the third week of April that weekly reviews of playing field conditions will be conducted to determine whether the field may be opened for students to play on. In the meantime, we have "tarmac only" recess. This means that students play only on paved areas. As these are limited, we are using the paved area adjacent to the parking lot for our grade 4 classes. We have supervision in place and review rules and expectations with students regularly. Basketballs will be made available for students to play with in this area. Once the field is ready for use, we will provide access for all students. As per board protocol we need to ensure pre-season limited grass use and take into consideration the safety of students when properly preparing the field for use including draining of excess water and grass growth. Thank you for continued support and understanding of our efforts.

Our School Council is now beginning to plan for our Annual End of Year Fun Fair which will take place in June. A lot of time goes into organizing this event with something for everyone to enjoy! ### Questioning

⇒ Children question the content, the author, the events, the issues, and the ideas in the text. When children question they are thinking about their reading.

What can you do?


Questions don't always have to be answered but can be used to help your child make inferences and interpretations of what they have read. Some questions might be as follows:

- ⇒ Can you tell me more about your thinking?
- ⇒ How did you come up with that?

**Parents as Partners in Preventing Bullying - Online and Offline**

Dr. Craig is a Professor in the Department of Psychology at Queen's University. She is co-leading PREVNet (Promoting Relationships and Eliminating Violence Network), a network to stop bullying in Canada. Her research focuses on healthy relationships, bullying and victimization. She has won many distinguished awards in recognition of her work. She regularly speaks to parents, educators, and professionals working with youth.

Bullying is a significant problem in our society and can have a significant impact on children's lives. In addition to traditional forms of bullying, online bullying through the use of technology is a serious concern. Technologies are changing the way we communicate, access, and share information. The Internet has opened the door to new learning and teaching opportunities. It has also raised issues about privacy, online respect, safety and appropriate uses for technology. Parents are critical in assisting their children in developing increased awareness, understanding and skills about being good digital citizens including an understanding of digital etiquette and appropriate use of the internet to promote safety online. Together with schools, parents can provide education how it affects others, to think and plan for using technology in the most appropriate way. The goal of this presentation is to empower parents in supporting their children by increasing their understanding about online and offline bullying and by providing concrete strategies to address it effectively in partnership with the school.

## Who Can Join

## Camp Sessions

We offer full day & half day sessions (morning or afternoon). For the COMPLETE camp experience, we recommend full day sessions as campers receive a soccer focus in the morning and a fun leisure swim with other camp activities in the afternoon. If you prefer only half days and want the soccer portion, we recommend registering for the morning sessions.

### Mornings

9 am - 12 noon Supervised early drop-off: 8-9am, no charge

Our morning sessions focus on soccer which include: warm up games and activities, individual skill development, fun team building exercises and Mini-World Cups.

Campers are grouped by age, size & ability where possible.

### Afternoons

1 pm - 4 pm Supervised late pickup: 4-5:30pm, no charge

Afternoon sessions consist of a less structured format that includes a supervised afternoon fun swim (no additional cost but is subject to pool ratios & availability) and a variety of camp games (fun swim is optional but most campers do participate). Our camp is required to adhere to local pool regulations and coordinate with onsite pool lifeguards for supervision. \* Supervised activities for campers choosing not to swim will depend on numbers and makeup of the group.
