

## Safety First: Parking Lot & Bus Loop



The parking lot is for staff and those who have meetings in the school.



Please use the **Kiss N Ride** to drop off children in the morning. Drive around the parking lot to the right and stop at the Kiss N Ride area located at the pavement to the left of the parking lot entrance. Release your child to the staff on duty and proceed out of the parking lot.



Our bus loop is to be used by school vehicles *only*.



There are *No Parking* signs located along the bus loop. Cars that are parked in this area will be tagged or towed. Officers regularly visit our school to enforce the law.

#### STUDENT SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

We will be sending home the Student Registration Verification forms. We ask you to please review, revise and return to the school as soon as possible.



As part of our student Safe Arrival program, please ensure to let the office know if your child will be absent from school or leaving early. We have a sign in/out book on our front counter for parents to sign their children in/out when they pick up or drop off throughout the day.

Also don't forget about our **24 hour absence recording line** that can be reached at **905-884-4022 and then press #2** You may inform us of any appointments or vacations that have been planned in advance.



#### ALLERGY-SAFE SCHOOL



Ross Doan Public School is a Healthy School which responds to the health and well-being of all our students. In keeping with best practices around the Board and issues of student health and safety, we are vigilant and insist that all food in the school meets "nut-free" guidelines. This includes all food sold/provided by staff, School Council, and others.

Please note the following as you are packing foods for your child to be eaten at school.

- 1. No nuts or nut products at any time in any classroom
- 2. No foods containing other known allergens in homeroom classes where anaphylactic students attend (ie. No shellfish in a room where a child is allergic to shellfish, etc.)
- 3. For religious, health, and dietary reasons, FOOD SHOULD NOT BE PROVIDED FOR CHILDREN'S BIRTHDAYS. If you wish to send in treats, please opt for non-food items.
- 4. Food will only be part of celebrations for unique and "special" classroom events, organized by a staff member
- 5. WE CANNOT ALLOW HOME-BAKED OR HOME-PREPARED FOODS TO BE SHARED IN THE CLASSROOM

#### Freedom of Information (Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act-MFOIPOP)

Throughout the school year, your child's identity and other information may be shared beyond the classroom and the school. Special fundraising events may attract media attention. Recordings and displays for events such as Arts Nights, seasonal celebrations, etc. are some examples. Please notify the school in writing if you wish to restrict the use of your child's personal information (e.g. display of work in the hall, newsletters, photos, interviews by press etc.).



#### **Medications**

Some of our students have life-threatening food allergies. If some of these students smell or come into contact with certain foods, they may go into "anaphylactic shock" - a potentially life-threatening condition. Medication must be administered by injection within minutes to those individuals in order to keep them safe.

To ensure the health and safety of all of our students, parents or guardians are asked to notify the school administration if their son or daughter has ANY medical condition or carries medication (i.e. inhaler, Epipen, etc.) Please obtain the necessary forms from the office or your child's teacher and ensure that you provide the school with all necessary medication as well as a photo of your child. Thank you!



# Safety Week: September 26 to 30

At Ross Doan, our students will engage in classroom discussions, highlighting the safety related themes including safety in the classroom and community. Safety needs to be on our minds all year round, but as the school year begins, it's especially important that students be reminded that staying safe requires awareness and planning.

#### Fire Drill

We will conduct our first Fire Drill during Safety Week so ensure that all members of Ross Doan school are aware of procedures including emergency exit doors during a fire situation. As per board policy, we will conduct 6 fire drills during the school year.

#### Lockdown Procedure

In addition to learning about safety issues, all school staff and students will participate in a "Lockdown" drill, intended to practice school responses to emergency situations. The purpose of the Lockdown response is to minimize risk to students and staff to the presence of an armed or dangerous intruder or other similar violent threats within the school. Please discuss with your children to support us in preparing them for this experience.

#### **Bus Evacuation**

Our school will be participating in our annual bus safety and evacuation program on October 14. 2016.

The students will review the rules of the bus and learn about the safety features on the bus. They will also take part in an emergency evacuation through the rear door of the school bus.

#### **HOLIDAYS AND OBSERVANCES**

We recognize and appreciate the diversity within our community. Please let your child's homeroom teacher know if your child requires any accommodation. For instance, if your child is fasting we have designated a fasting classroom during lunch time.

#### **BIRTHDAY TREATS**

Due to Ministry Health Regulations, edible birthday/special occasions treats from hare no longer be allowed at Ross Doan Public School.

Please do not send any treats with your child to share with his/her class.

Special pencils or erasers are a great alternative for student to share.



# The Zones of Regulation

Over the past few years, Ross Doan PS embraced the Zones of Regulation program for students, staff, and our community. Developed by Leah Kuypers, the Zones program is designed to help you to be aware of your feelings and learn how to control them in different situations and contexts. There are four Zones that represent different emotions, Blue, Green, Yellow, and Red. Everyone experiences all of the Zones, and they are all expected at one time or another. Through presentations and different classroom activities, students and teachers have learned about each Zone. We have learned that the Green Zone is the optimal Zone for learning, because in this Zone students feel calm, focused, and ready to work. We have also been investigating different tools and strategies that we can use to get back to or remain in the Green Zone. We are looking forward to continuing our learning and exploring of this excellent program!
