Dear Parents/Guardians.

I'd like to take this opportunity to extend a warm welcome to students and parents at Rouge Park Public School. I am truly excited to start off the year teaching instrumental and vocal music to our students at Rouge Park from Kindergarten to Grade 8.

Our 2019-2020 music program will cover multidisciplinary themes linking music to a range of disciplines including History, Mathematics, Science, Language, Dance and Business. We will develop standard musical warm-up procedures and work through standard Recorder (Gr.1 – Gr. 4) and Essential Elements method books (Gr.5 – Gr.8). We will also be working through the G.P.S. program (Grade Performance Steps - GPS).

Your child's assessment will be based on in-class performances from their respective musical method books and the GPS program, which includes individual and group playing tests and other performance tasks. In addition, for our students Grade 4-8, each unit will contain a "Special Theme" which will include such topics as the global history of music, film scoring, music technology, music and mathematical formulas for learning, and world music with a focus on Indian, Arabic, Chinese, Thai, European and African music systems. Our special theme assignments will include writing and presentation components in various degrees of depth depending on grade level.

Beyond our classes, there will be a number of musical opportunities for our students, including musical groups that will rehearse weekly and in some cases bi-weekly during lunch hour. Your child will have the opportunity to join the following groups to name a few: Gr.1-4 Recorder Group, Gr.1-3 Primary Choir, Gr 4-8 Junior/Intermediate Choir, Gr. 7-8 Instrumental Band, and Guitar/Ukulele/Violin Club.

Having performed music globally, taught at elementary, secondary and university environments in Asia, Africa, Europe, South America and North America, and remaining active as a musical performer, writer and educator, my goal as a teacher will be to provide our students with a global learning perspective. My goal for our students is to become global citizens and develop an appreciation for the beauty and wealth of music in our world both past and present. Our special themes will provide students with the opportunity to take lessons learned through musical performance and apply them to other disciplines and all aspects of their lives.
