## Driving & Safety for All

Community safety is a high priority for us all-year round. We have been communicating with the **York Region Police and the City of Markham** to advocate for and school safety measures as we appreciate the urgency of traffic-related matters. The Traffic staff for Markham will monitor, assess and evaluate the traffic needs surrounding the school and further decisions will be implemented based on their findings and recommendations. The York Region Police have been in the area to remind vehicle owners of speed limits and City by-laws, and I suspect they will continue to be more present to help the community become more aware of school zone regulations. Now that the school is open, the City of Markham will also be monitoring the need for School Crossing Guards. We will share their findings with you when the Traffic surveys have been completed and shared with the school.

Please continue to be extremely careful with driving, walking and cycling at and around the school.

Drivers on school property are reminded to drive slowly and cautiously as we have 400 children arriving to and leaving from school at the same time of the day.

Whether you're cycling, skateboarding, riding, walking or driving, road safety in our school zones is everyone's responsibility. Here's how you can do your part.

#### Pedestrians:

- Always use sidewalks and crosswalks
- Look both ways and only cross the roadway when it is clear
- Be visible and indicate which direction you are crossing
- Walk, don't run or cycle, when crossing
- Make eye contact with drivers

#### Drivers:

- Reduce your speed
- Be prepared to stop at all times
- If dropping children off, have them exit on the passenger side
- Be extra cautious in or near school parking lots
- Always stop for school buses with lights and stop signs activated

#### All Road Users:

- Be alert
- Be patient
- Obey crossing guards
- Don't be distracted by electronic devices
- Keep your eyes up and ears open
- Follow all the rules of road—they apply to everyone



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#### <u>Kiss and Ride Lane</u>

If you do not need to get out of the car and would like to drop your children off in the Kiss and Ride lane, please be sure to drive only in the lane closest to the school, marked "Kiss and Ride Lane". *Children should only exit the car from the passengers' side safely.* 

Move all the way along the Kiss And Ride Lane before stopping behind the vehicle in front of you to safely allow your child to exit and proceed into the school from the back tarmac.

If you are parking on RIVERLANDS AVENUE, please use the sidewalk and intersections to escort your child(ren) to or from the school. It is unsafe to allow them to walk across Riverlands Avenue and through the bus loop to get to and from school.



#### **BUS DROP OFF AND PICK UP LANES**

The driveway at the front of the school is a FIRE ROUTE. You may be ticketed by the YRP if you park there. Please follow the traffic and no parking signs that are posted.

This driveway is ONLY to be used by the **School Bus company to drop off and pick up** our students who travel by bus to and from school.

#### YRDSB SAFE ARRIVAL POLICY

#### Parents/Guardians are responsible for:

ensuring the school has complete and current emergency contact information;

• communicating with the school about any absences, lateness or change in safe departure plans for their child as soon as possible; and

• making decisions about sending their child to school, using their best judgement, when buses are cancelled.

#### School staff members are responsible for.

• ensuring that attendance is taken and any unexplained student absence is addressed immediately.

Our secretarial staff will need to contact you or your emergency contact to confirm your child's absence if you have not called the school to inform us. Thank you in advance for helping us to ensure your child is safe and accounted for.

#### **CARING AND SAFE SCHOOLS INFORMATION**

Dear families,

It is important to us that we provide a caring, safe and inclusive environment in our school that supports the academic achievement and well-being of all students. On Monday, September 16, we will have school assemblies to talk about some of the important elements of a caring and safe school. After the assemblies, you may want to have a conversation with your child about what they learned and discussed. Topics covered will include:

#### **Positive Behaviour**

Students are encouraged to demonstrate positive character attributes (such as empathy, courage and respect for human rights and inclusivity). We also discussed standing up for each other in bullying situations and the importance of reporting incidents of bullying, including:

- Telling a caring adult
- Using the YRDSB's <u>"Report It Button</u>" (located on our school website)
- Contacting <u>Kids Help Phone</u> (1-800-668-6868)

#### Student Discipline

We use a progressive discipline approach when inappropriate behaviour occurs. This means we consider a range of options to determine the most appropriate response to each situation to help students learn from their choices. In some cases, suspension or expulsion may be necessary. The **Ontario Education Ac**t and our **Board Caring and Safe Schools Policy** outline the situations in which suspension and expulsion must be considered. These infractions are also outlined in the *Guide to the School Year*. When inappropriate behaviour occurs, information will be shared with the victim and parents/guardians of the victim to the extent that legislation allows.

#### Tobacco/Alcohol/Drug-Free Environment

The use of tobacco, electronic products (such as vaping, electronic cigarettes and cigars and related products) and/or student possession of alcohol/illegal and restricted drugs, including cannabis, are prohibited **on school property or within 20 metres of school boundaries.** This also applies during Board or school-sponsored events and activities. This is in compliance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act, which is enforced locally by York Region Community and Health Services and the Tobacco and Smoke-Free Environment Policy and Procedure. A progressive form of discipline, including suspension from school and fines (up to \$5,000), is in place for students who break the law. In accordance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act (SFOA), exceptions are made for the traditional use of tobacco that forms part of Indigenous culture and spirituality.

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At our Caring & Safe Schools assemblies, we will also discuss the potential harms associated with vaping and e-cigarettes, including that e-cigarettes can contain nicotine, formaldehyde and other harmful chemicals, and are being used to inhale other harmful substances such as marijuana, weight loss supplements and other drugs. <u>Partnership for Drug Free Kids also provides a resource on how to talk to your</u> <u>kids about vaping</u>.

#### Appropriate Use of Technology

Students will be reminded about the **Appropriate Use of Technology agreement**, including the importance of using respectful language and making positive choices when using electronic communications and social media tools.

Students will also be reminded that threats made online are taken seriously and may have serious consequences, including potential criminal charges. Where there are concerns for the safety of students, staff, community members or Board property, the school board works closely with York Regional Police and appropriate actions are taken. **The safety and well-being of students and staff remains our top priority.**
