Planning for Next Year:

Planning for the 2024-2025 school year is underway. If you are moving, please let our office know as soon as possible. Class Placement for the 2024-2025 School Year

As we organize for next year, our staff will make every effort to place students in the best learning environment for each child to be successful. We take into account Ministry and Board guidelines, individual needs, academic achievement, emotional and social development, behaviours, gender balance, English Language Learners and Special Education needs, and work habits. We appreciate that parents/guardians have valuable information to share with us in this regard. If you have information or suggestions, which will assist us in making appropriate placements, please write a brief note to Lindsey Maclean by Friday, May 10th, 2024: lindsey.maclean@yrdsb.ca . Rather than suggesting a teacher, please indicate the learning style or classroom structure which you feel would be the most appropriate for your child's success. When teachers along with school administration get together to create new class lists, we will use this information to help make our final decisions.

Sewing Studio

We are excited that Roland Acheampong and Denise Wild's Sewing Studio program will be coming to inspire students at Rouge Park Public School between May 13-15. Students will have the chance to learn how to sew, while working on a small project. The Sewing Studio teachers will donate one sewing machine to our school Maker Space, for students to continue to use their sewing skills afterwards. The program costs \$20. Walking and Wheeling to School

We strongly encourage all of our students who are not on the bus to walk or wheel to school. Walking or wheeling to school allows you to get exercise and fresh air before starting the school day. We even have bike racks for your use!



Important Reminders Re: Drop off and Pick up:

Please remember to drive slowly in and around the school area when dropping off and picking up your children. Our kiss'n ride is a slow zone and cars should be travelling in a single line without passing or overtaking others. We are reminding all kindergarten families to either use the kiss'n ride or park on the street and walk your child to their gate. The loop at the front of the school is for our school buses and vans only. Thank you for working with us to ensure a safe school environment and one in which we build independence in our students.

We are also reminding all families that the parking lot at the back side of the school is reserved for daycare only. Please do not pull into this parking lot to drop your child off.

- By email Families can download the <u>Elementary School Registration Form</u> at <u>www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten</u> and email the completed form to their school email address.
- By phone Families can request support to complete the registration form on their behalf by collecting the required information by phone. Families can request an interpreter, if needed.
- In-person at the school Families may visit the school office to drop off or complete a registration form.

YORK REGION PUBLIC HEALTH DENTAL SCREENING 2023-2024

Community and Health Services Public Health Branch

Dear Parent or Guardian,

Dental health contributes to general health and well-being. This letter is to inform you that dental screening will be conducted at your child's school by a Registered Dental Hygienist.

<u>All students in grades JK, SK, 2, and 7 will be screened</u> as well as others as requested by parents/guardians.

Dental screening consists of a quick look in the mouth using a single-use mirror for each child. School screening does not take the place of a regular dental check-up. York Region Public Health follows Oral Health Protocol, 2021 of the Ontario Public Health Standards from the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care.

How will I receive my child's screening results?

- Parents/Guardians will be notified of screening results using the email provided by your child's school
- If you would like to receive a paper copy of your child's screening results instead of an email, please call us at 1-877-464-9675 ext. 74395
- Parents/Guardians of children with urgent dental findings will be contacted by phone and your child may be rescreened at their school on a later date to confirm that treatment has been initiated

If you would like your child screened every year, and they are not in one of the grades listed:

- Notify the Child and Youth Dental Program before the dental screening date by leaving a message at 1-877-464-9675 ext. 74395
- Provide your child's first and last name (including the spelling), school, grade, date of birth and phone number
- Once we receive notice, your child will receive dental screening every year while attending this school

If you DO NOT want your child to participate in screening:

- Notify the Child and Youth Dental Program before the dental screening date by leaving a message at 1-877-464-9675 ext. 74395
- Provide your child's first and last name (including the spelling), school, grade, date of birth and phone number
- Once we receive notice that you do not want dental screening, your child will not receive future dental screenings while attending this school

Healthy Smiles Ontario

If the cost of dental care would create financial hardship, you may be eligible for the <u>Healthy</u> <u>Smiles Ontario (HSO)</u> program. HSO provides no-cost emergency care and routine dental care such as checkups, x-rays, fillings, and preventive services such as cleaning, fluoride treatments, and pit and fissure sealants for eligible children.

Collection of Information

Please note that any information collected during your child's dental screening is done in agreement with the Health Protection and Promotion Act. Records of parent requests to exclude children from screening, as well as requests for yearly screening, will be maintained while the child remains in the stated school.

In addition, the collection, use, disclosure, and disposal of this information is subject to the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act and the Personal Health Information Protection Act. HOW TO ACCESS ENCRYPTED EMAIL FROM PUBLIC HEALTH

Community and Health Services Public Health Branch

Dear Parent/Guardian,

You will be receiving a **secure** (encrypted) email from York Region Public Health. It will include important information about your child's school dental screening results.

To open the encrypted email from childrens.dental@york.ca and/or dental.screening@york.ca, please follow the steps below.

Step 1 - Open the encrypted email and select "Read the message"

Step 2 - Select the preferred option:

Option 1: Sign in with a "Google Account" or

- Option 2: Sign in with a one-time passcode
- Go back to your inbox and check for a new email with the subject "Microsoft Office 365. Your one-time passcode to view the message"
- Get your passcode and return to your open internet tab to enter the code
- Enter the passcode and select Continue to access the document

Tips

- Open an encrypted email from your desktop, not a mobile device and close multiple tabs open to the internet
- Use the one-time passcode method

YRDSB SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Being a spectator (or presenter, player or performer) at our school is a privilege. Events are extensions of our school day, so all School and Board policies and procedures apply. To be permitted to attend events, all students, staff, parents, caregivers and guests must follow the Spectator Code of Conduct and the directives of school administrators or designates.

BE COURTEOUS AND RESPECTFUL

School events are intended to build school culture, spirit and community.

Presenters, players and performers have worked hard for these events. Let's keep these events positive, fun and safe for everyone. Show respect for players, staff, coaches, spectators and officials.

BE POSITIVE

Verbal taunts, negative chants or signage towards players, staff, coaches, spectators and officials are prohibited. Positive cheers and signs are welcome!

Verbal altercations, abusive language (including sexist, racist, homophobic and transphobic language), and physical altercations are prohibited.

PRIVACY RULES APPLY

Photographs or videos are prohibited unless there is written permission from the student(s) and/or the staff who are being filmed. Coaches or other representatives from private organizations may not solicit players at YRDSB events (unless, in certain circumstances, there is prior permission granted from a school administrator).

RESPECT PLAYING SPACES

Only players, coaches, and officials are permitted in playing spaces. Spectators must remain in the designated areas (i.e. bleachers, stands). Items must not be thrown into the playing or performing space.

RESPECT CHANGING SPACES

Only coaches (when appropriate) and players are permitted in change rooms. Change rooms are to be locked at all times.

RESPECT OUR OFFICIALS

Decisions made by officials are final and are to be respected. Interference with gameplay, competition or a performance is prohibited.

RESPECT PROPERTY AND TIME

All participants are responsible for their own property.

Valuables must not be brought to or left unattended at school events.

Once the event is concluded, all participants are expected to leave the school property shortly thereafter.

BE RESPECTFUL AND SUPPORTIVE IN BOTH VICTORY AND DEFEAT

Regardless of the event outcome, all participants are expected to demonstrate appropriate behaviours.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE YRDSB SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT MAY LEAD TO IMMEDIATE **REMOVAL FROM THE EVENT AND ADDITIONAL CONSEQUENCES.**

Spectators must not present a safety concern.

Concerns must be brought to the attention of the school administration.
